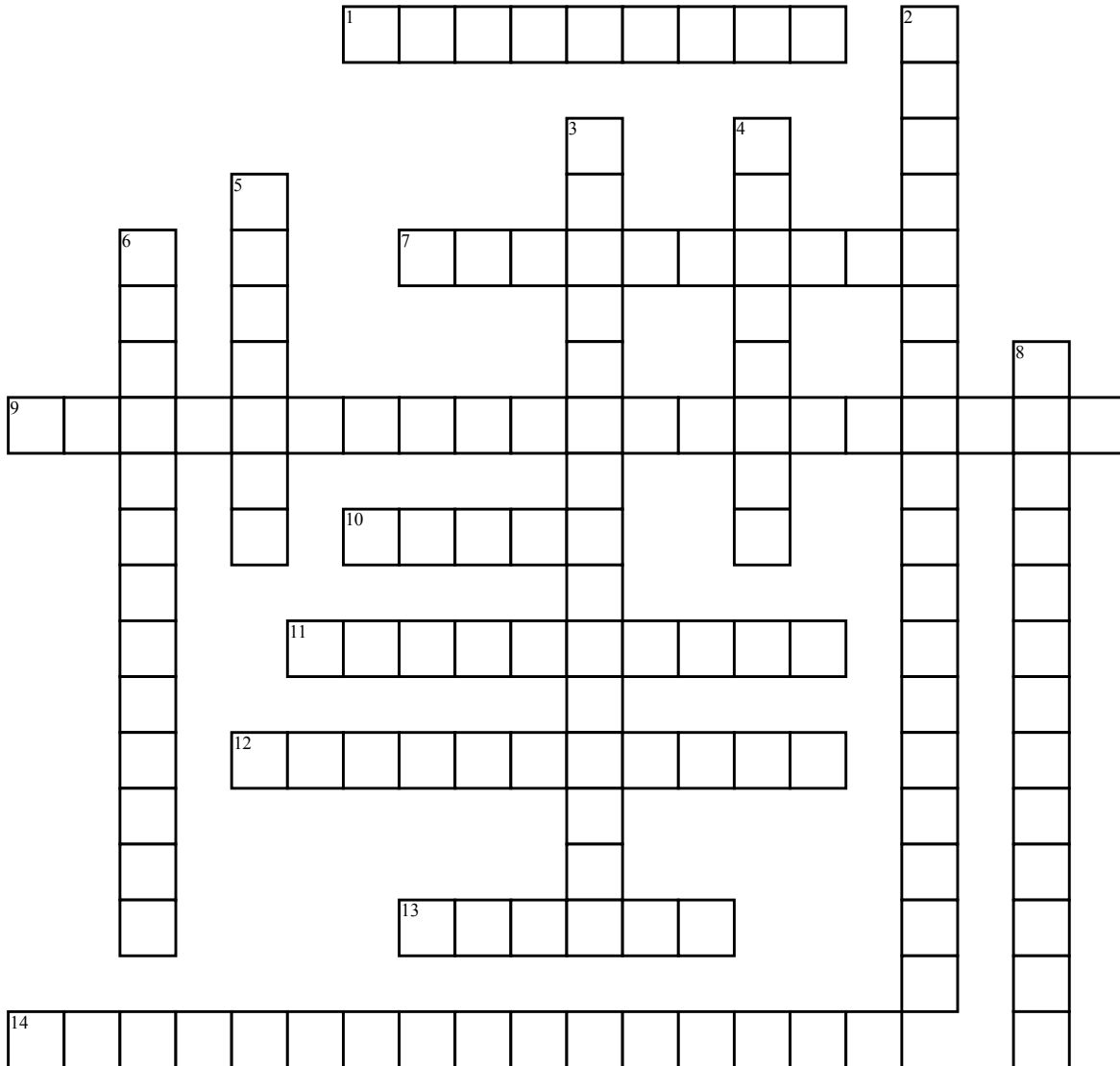


Congress Needs Your Help!
