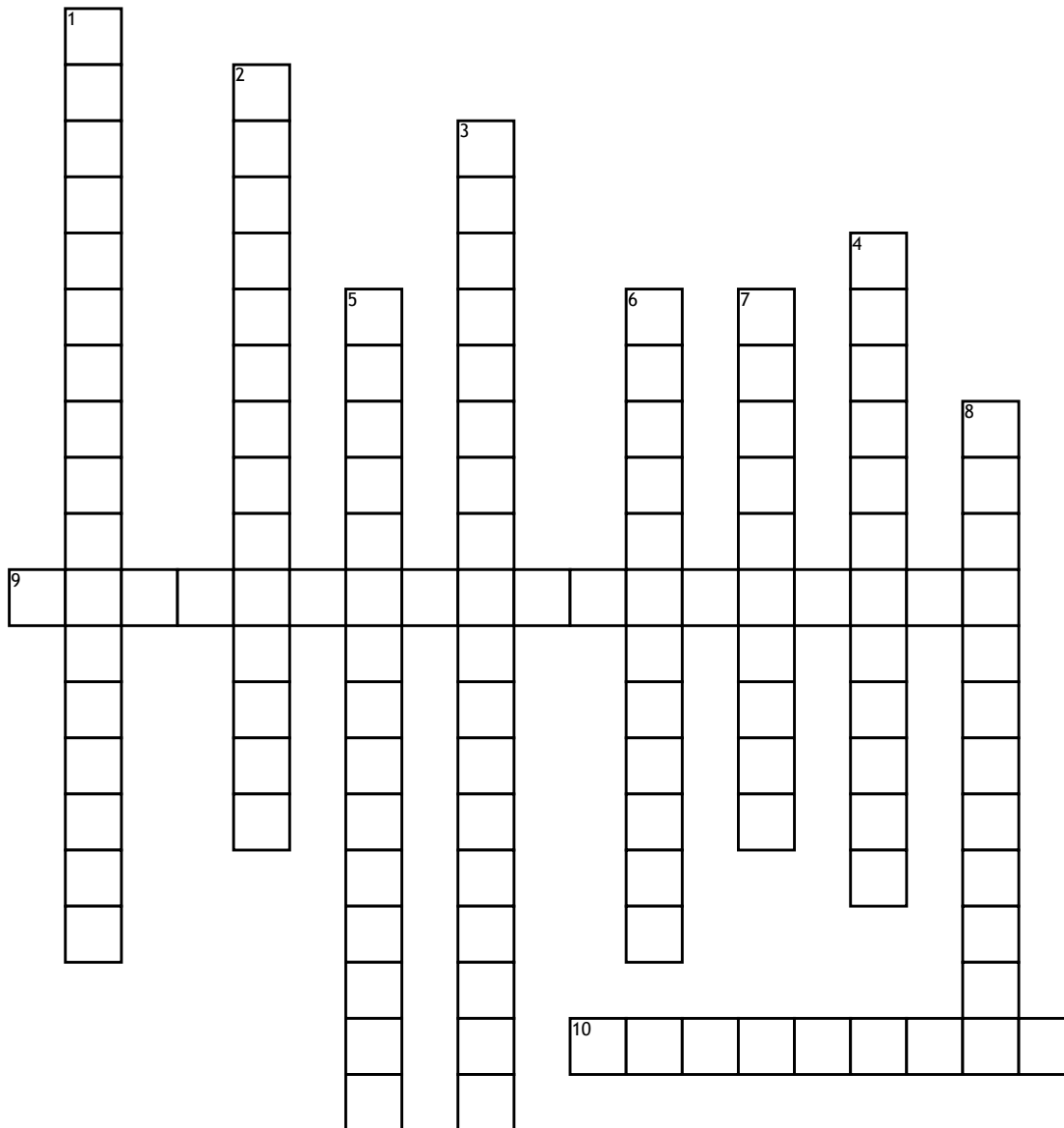

- 9.** s the division of basic government roles into branches. No one branch is given all the power.
- 10.** the process of altering or amending a law or document (such as a constitution) by parliamentary or constitutional procedure. an alteration proposed or effected by this process.

- 1.** the branch of government having the power to make laws
- 2.** the branch of government charged with the interpretation of laws and the administration of justice,
- 3.** a doctrine in political theory that government is created by and subject to the will of the people

- 4.** the highest federal court in the US, consisting of nine justices and taking judicial precedence over all other courts in the nation.
- 5.** the branch of government charged with the execution and enforcement of laws and policies and the administration of public affairs
- 6.** the first 10 amendments establish the most basic freedoms for Americans, including the rights to worship, speak, and peacefully assemble and protest their government how they want.
- 7.** a requirement that legal matters be resolved according to established rules and principles and that individuals be treated fairly.
- 8.** basic framework for the system of Government
