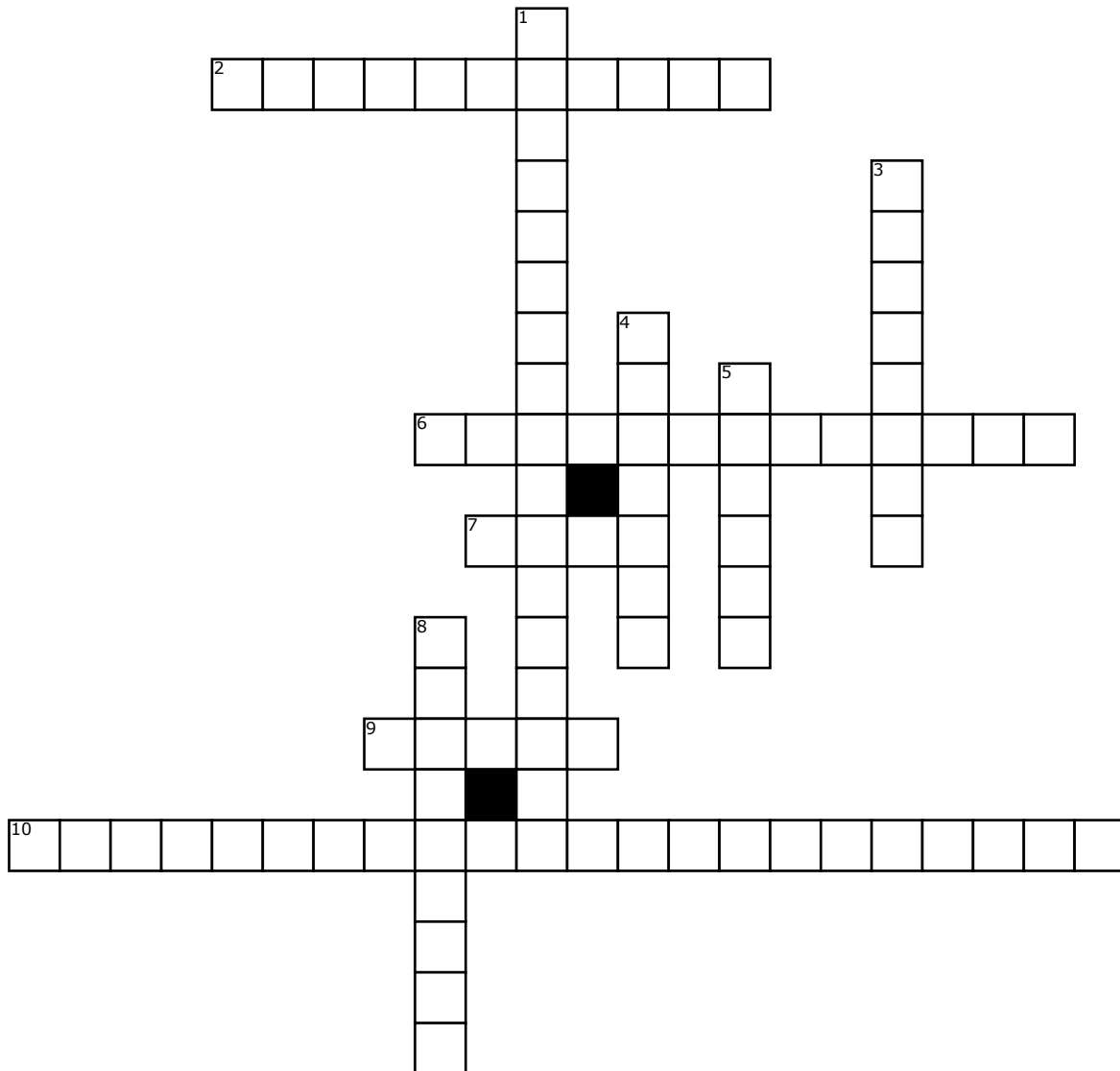


# Constitutional Rights at Trial
