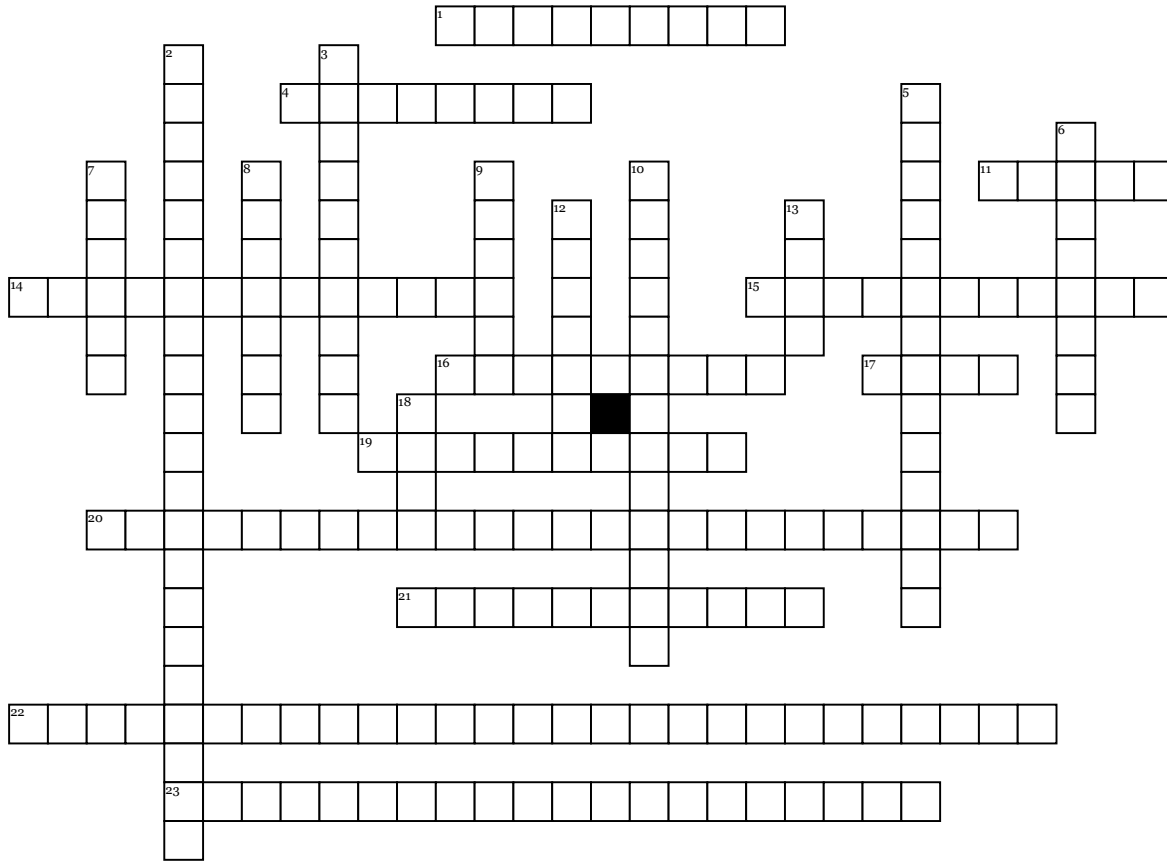


# Court System Vocabulary
