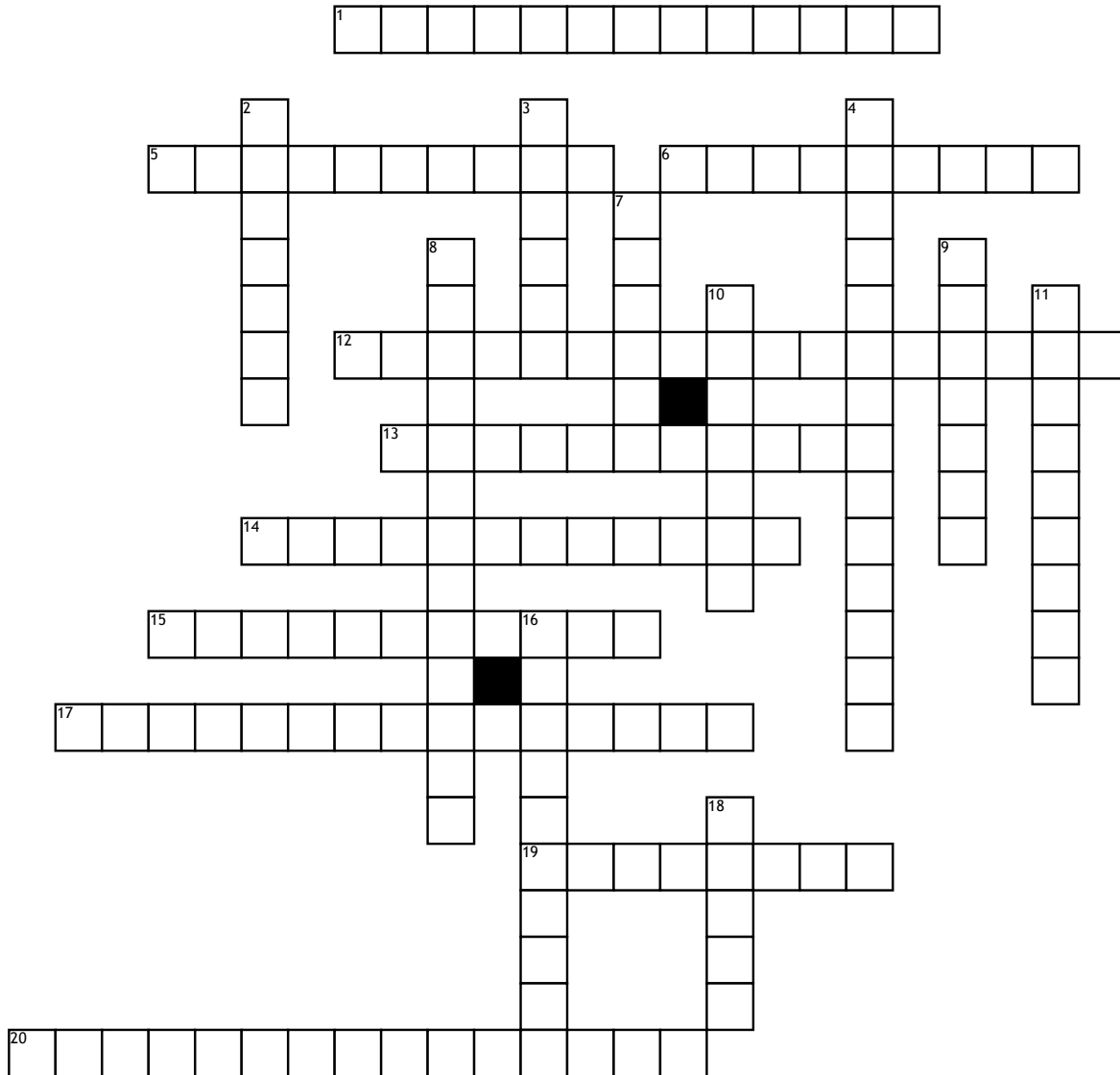


Criminal Justice

- 1. action of showing something to be right or reasonable
- 5. violation or infringement of a law, agreement, or set of rules
- 6. custom and judicial precedent rather than statutes
- 12. forms of defense challenging the legitimacy of the legal proceeding
- 13. a countermeasure that involves defending the health and well-being of oneself from harm
- 14. written law set down by a body of legislature or by a singular legislator (in the case of an absolute monarchy)
- 15. law concerned with the punishment of those who commit crimes
- 17. lack of slight diligence or care

- 19. system of law concerned with private relations between members of a community rather than criminal
- 20. defense to the prosecution for a criminal act which, according to the defendant results from his/her cultural background

- 2. breach of a law or rule; an illegal act

- 4. prosecution of a person twice for the same offense
