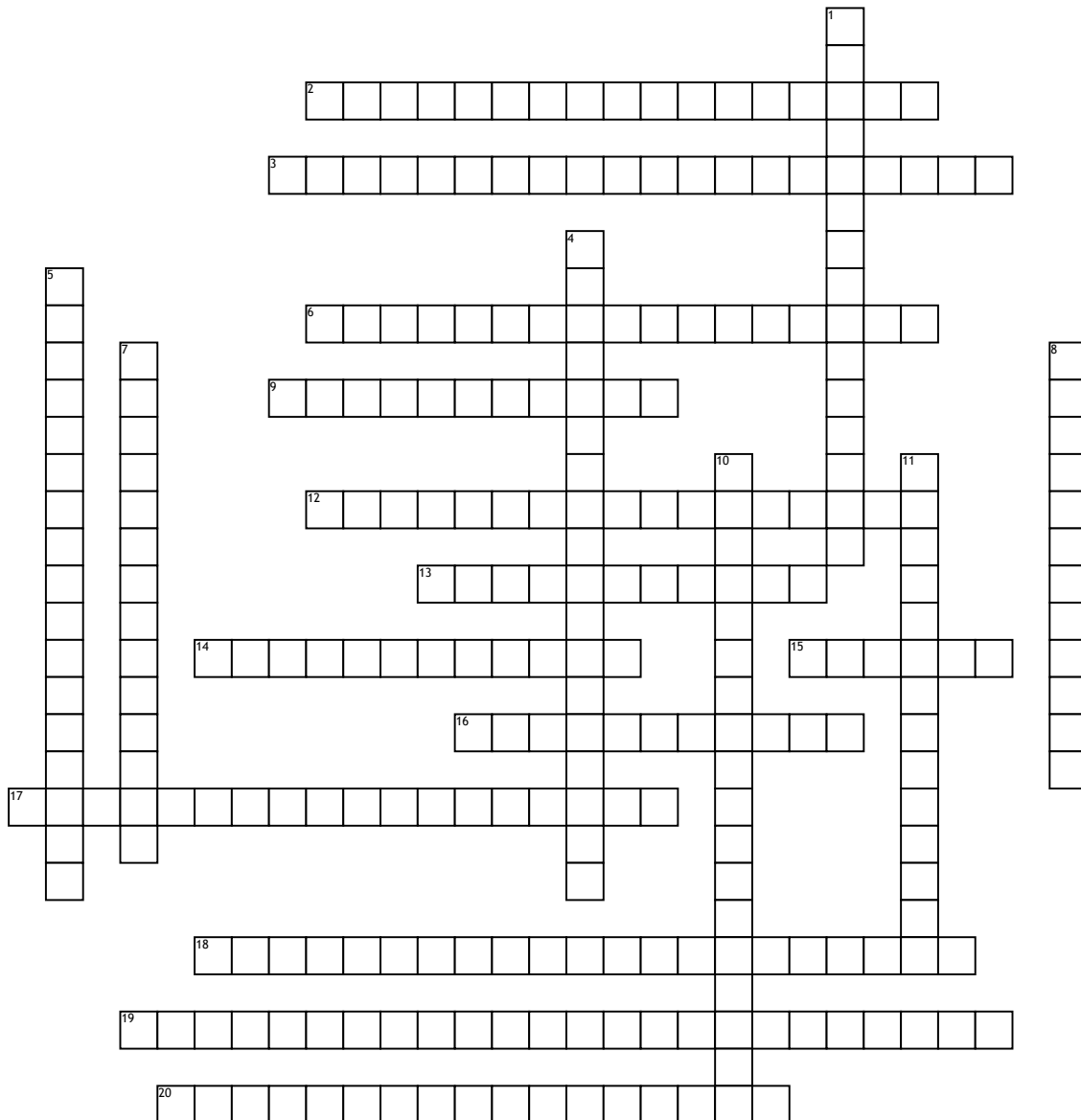


# Criminal Justice Extra Credit

2. The view of punishment being a natural response to a wrongful doing  
 3. sanctions imposed on convicted adults or adjudicated juveniles that occur in a residential or community setting outside of jail or prison

15. This concept is expressed when society treats similar crimes and similar criminals alike  
 16. punishment inflicted on someone as vengeance for a wrong or criminal act  
 17. sanctions outside of the formal criminal justice system will deter the individual from committing the crime  
 18. The observation that essentially all prisoners return to live in free society  
 19. This removes a defendant from prosecution prior to a guilty or no contest plea  
 20. always obeys the law and is considered to be good and honest because of this
