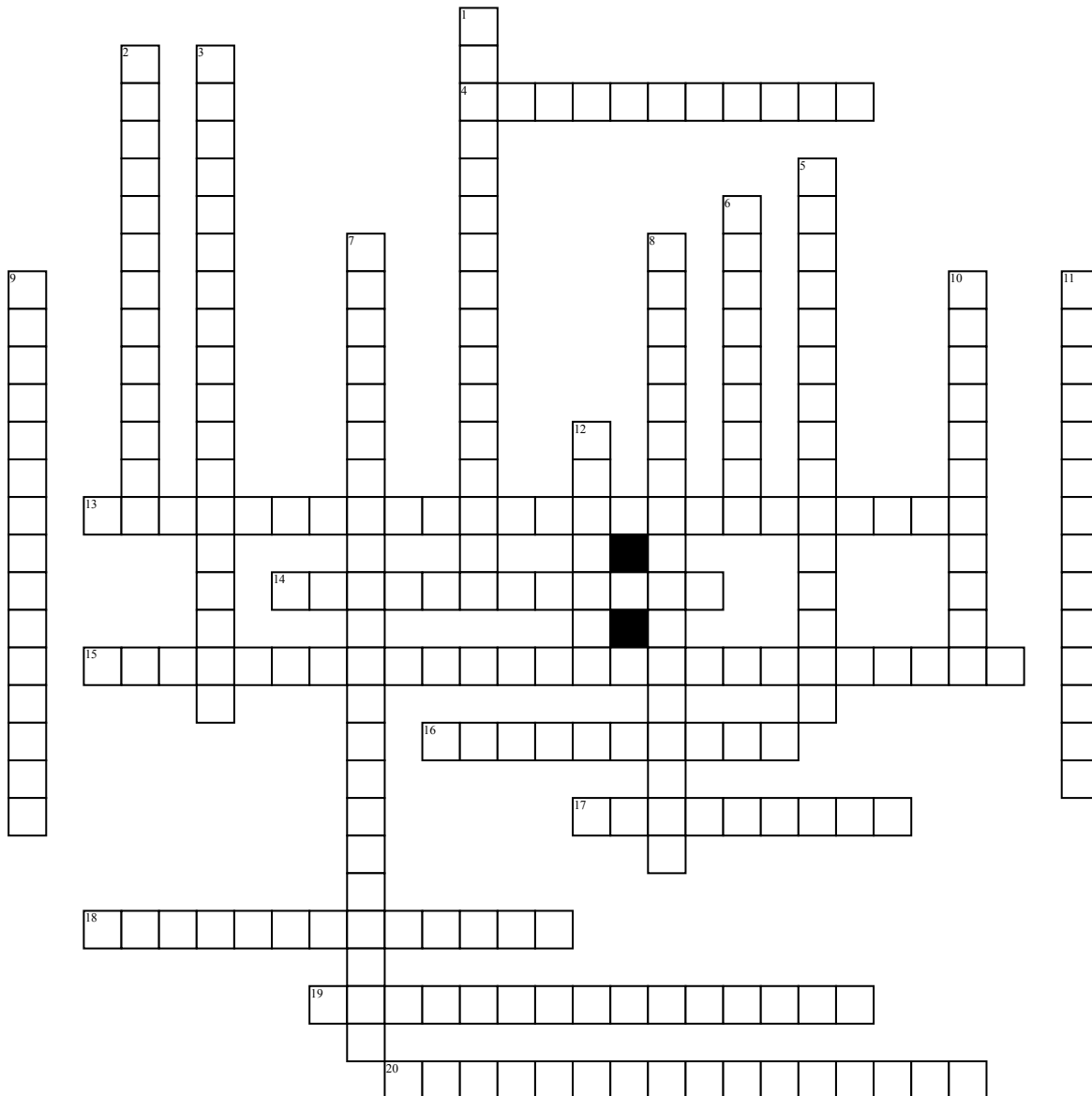


Death and Dying

4. Study of death, dying, grief, bereavement and social attitudes toward these issues
13. Process in which physicians provide dying patients with a fatal dose of medication that the patient self-administers
14. Feeling of anxiety or even fear of death
15. Situation in which a person's cortical functioning ceases while brainstem activity continues
16. Practice of ending life for reasons of mercy
17. Psychological side of coming to terms with bereavement
18. Way for people to make their choices known about how they do or do not want their lives to end

19. Expression of complicated or prolonged grief disorder that includes disbelief about the death
20. View of coping with bereavement that integrates loss-oriented stressors

1. deliberate ending of someone's life
2. Lack of heartbeat and respiration
3. Expression of complicated or prolonged grief disorder that includes being preoccupied with the deceased to the point that it interferes with everyday functioning
5. Issues pertaining to management of the final phase of life after death disposition of the body and memorial services and distribution of assets
6. Study of the interface between human values and technological advances in health and life sciences

7. Theory that addresses the issue of why people engage in certain behaviors to achieve particular psychological states based on their deeply rooted concerns about mortality
8. Practice of allowing a person to die by withholding available treatment
9. Declared only when the deceased meets eight criteria
10. State or condition caused by loss through death
11. Care that is focused on providing relief from pain and other symptoms of disease at any point during the disease process
12. Approach to assisting dying people that emphasizes pain management or palliative care and death with dignity
