1. surgical interruption of pain pathways in the spinal cord
 2. discomfort that originates at the skin level
 3. naturally produced morphine-like chemicals
 4. someone who pretends to be sick or in pain
 5. chemicals that stimulate nociceptors
 6. nerve receptors that transmit pain impulses
 7. surgical sectioning of a nerve root close to the spinal cord
 8. discomfort generated from deeper connective tissue
 9. oral dose that provides the same level of pain relief as a

 16. delivery of 100% oxygen at 3 times the normal atmospheric pressure in an air tight chamber
 17. a lipoprotein produced by cells in the alveoli that promotes elasticity of lungs and enhances gas diffusion
 18. the client is in a seated position with the arms supported on pillows or the arm rests on a chair
 19. oxygen delivery device that mixes a precise amount of oxygen and atmospheric air
 20. is a noninvasive, transcutaneous technique for periodically or continuously monitoring the oxygen saturation of blood
