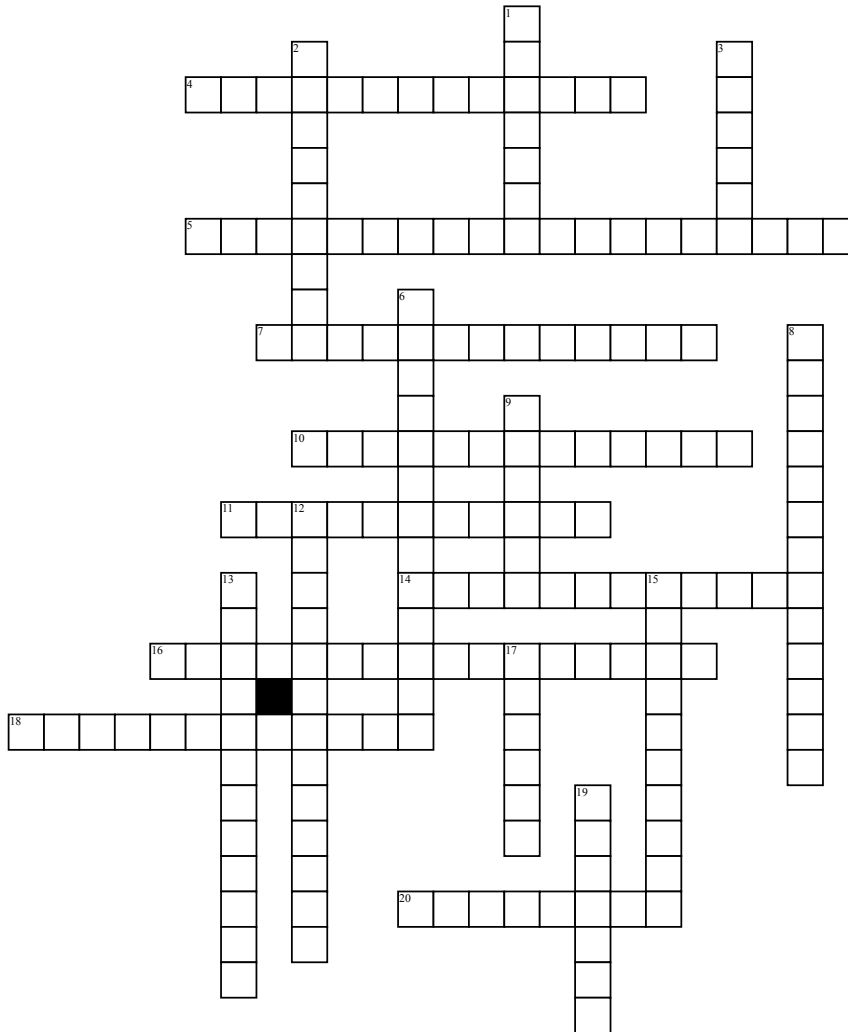


Dia de los Muertos

- 7. These were giant paper mache puppets that modeled calacas y calaveras.
- 10. Known to quench the thirst of the spirits.
- 11. The person who changed La Calavera Garbancera to La Calavera de la Catrina
- 14. Children's souls that return the night of the 31st of October and leave the day of November 1st.
- 16. This was the main religion of the Spanish.

- 18. Can be formed from clay, sugar, or paper mache.
- 20. These are pictures of loved ones who are being honored.

Down

- 1. This traces back to the Aztec word "copalli."
- 2. An altar for the dead we wish to honor.
- 3. This group of people believed it was disrespectful to mourn the dead.
- 6. These were colorful kites that carry messages for the deceased on Dia de los Muertos.

- 8. This is Ecuador's name for the "bread of the dead"
- 9. Provides light to guide the spirits to the ofrenda.
- 12. Bread that is decorated with bones on the top and is placed on ofrendas.
- 13. This flower has a scent that is said to guide spirits to the ofrenda.
- 15. Shows death enjoying life.
- 17. This represents the Roman Catholic Faith.
- 19. This is the dwelling of Micetahcacihuatl.
