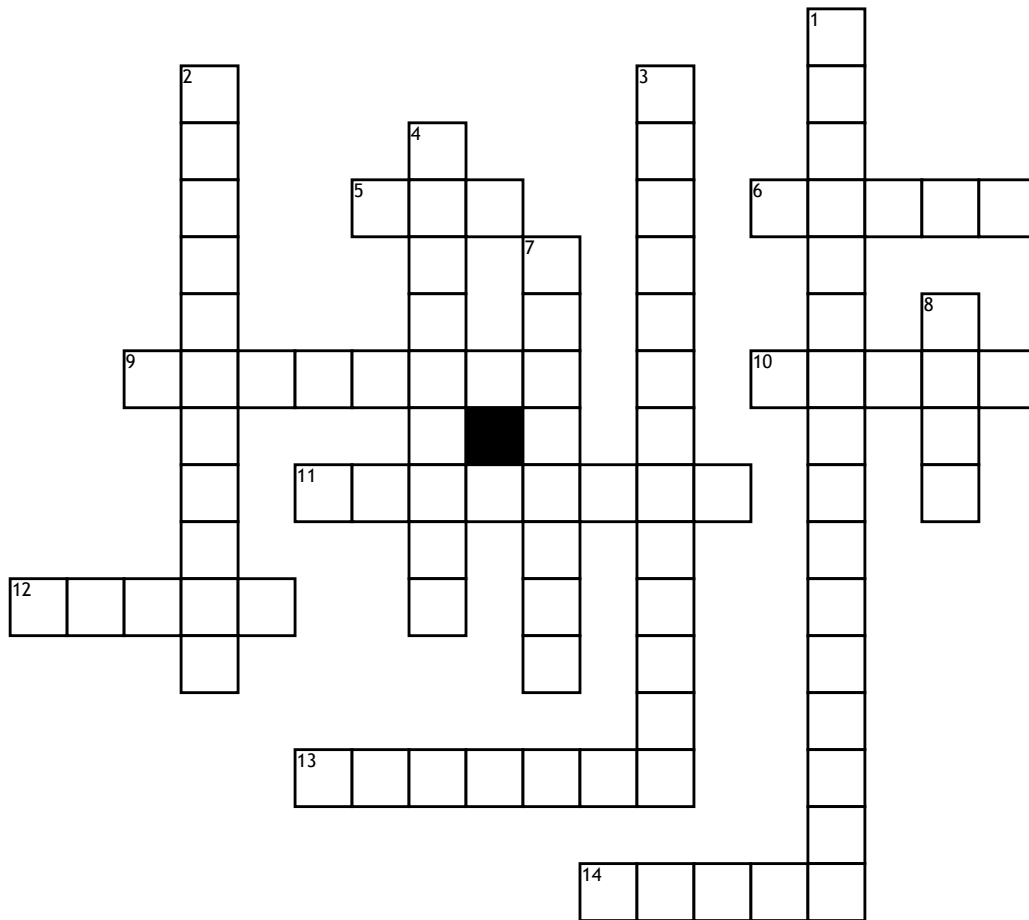

- 10. This place's authorities adopted Chinese court rituals and rankings and established a Chinese based taxation system
- 11. This religion became favored in China during the Tang dynasty

13. This place's elites borrowed bureaucracy and confucian based schools from China.

14. This place embraced Chinese culture, and China used them to diffuse Buddhism.
