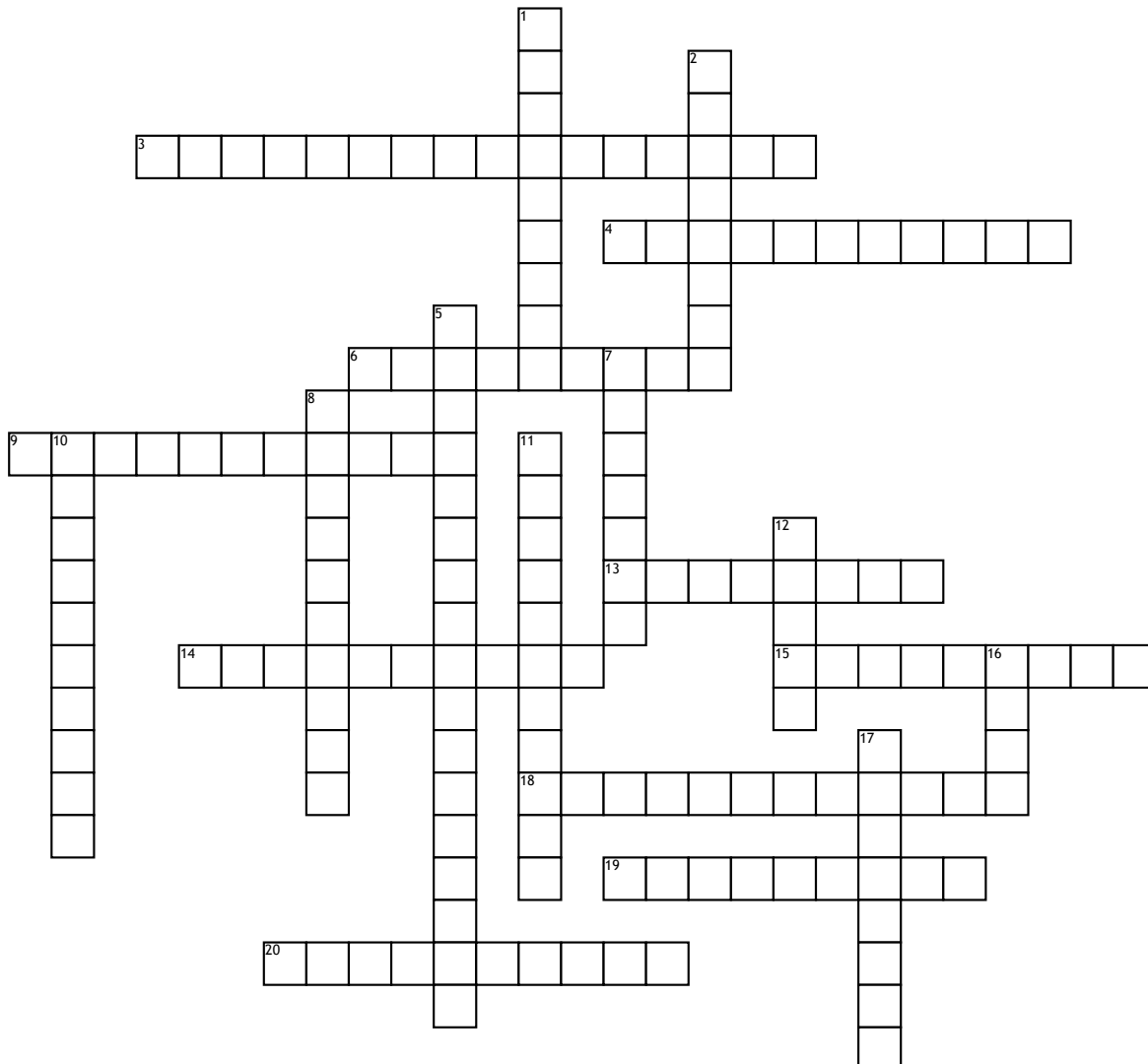


# Eastern Mediterranean Tsunami Of 1303

20. a smaller earthquake that occurs after a previous large earthquake, in the same area of the main shock.

11. an instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
