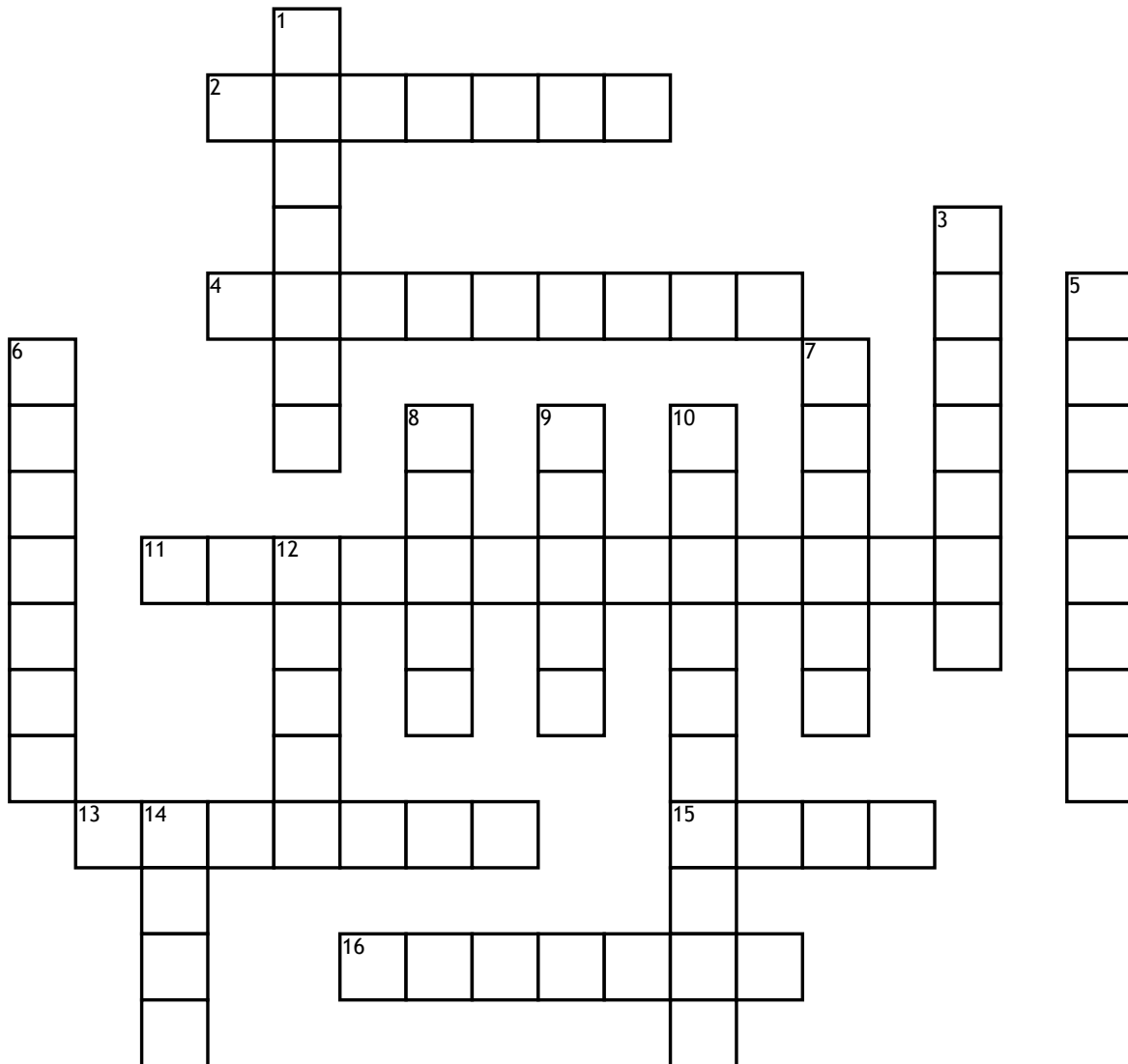

 6. A two-wheeled horse drawn vehicle used in ancient warfare and racing.
 7. A mythical creature with the head of a human and the body of a lion. Known for their strength and role as a guardian.

8. An ornamental headdress worn by a ruler as a symbol of authority, usually made of or decorated with precious metals and jewels.
 9. A fan-shaped area of silt near where a river flows into the sea.
 10. A journey or voyage undertaken by a group of people with a particular purpose, usually exploration, research, or war.
