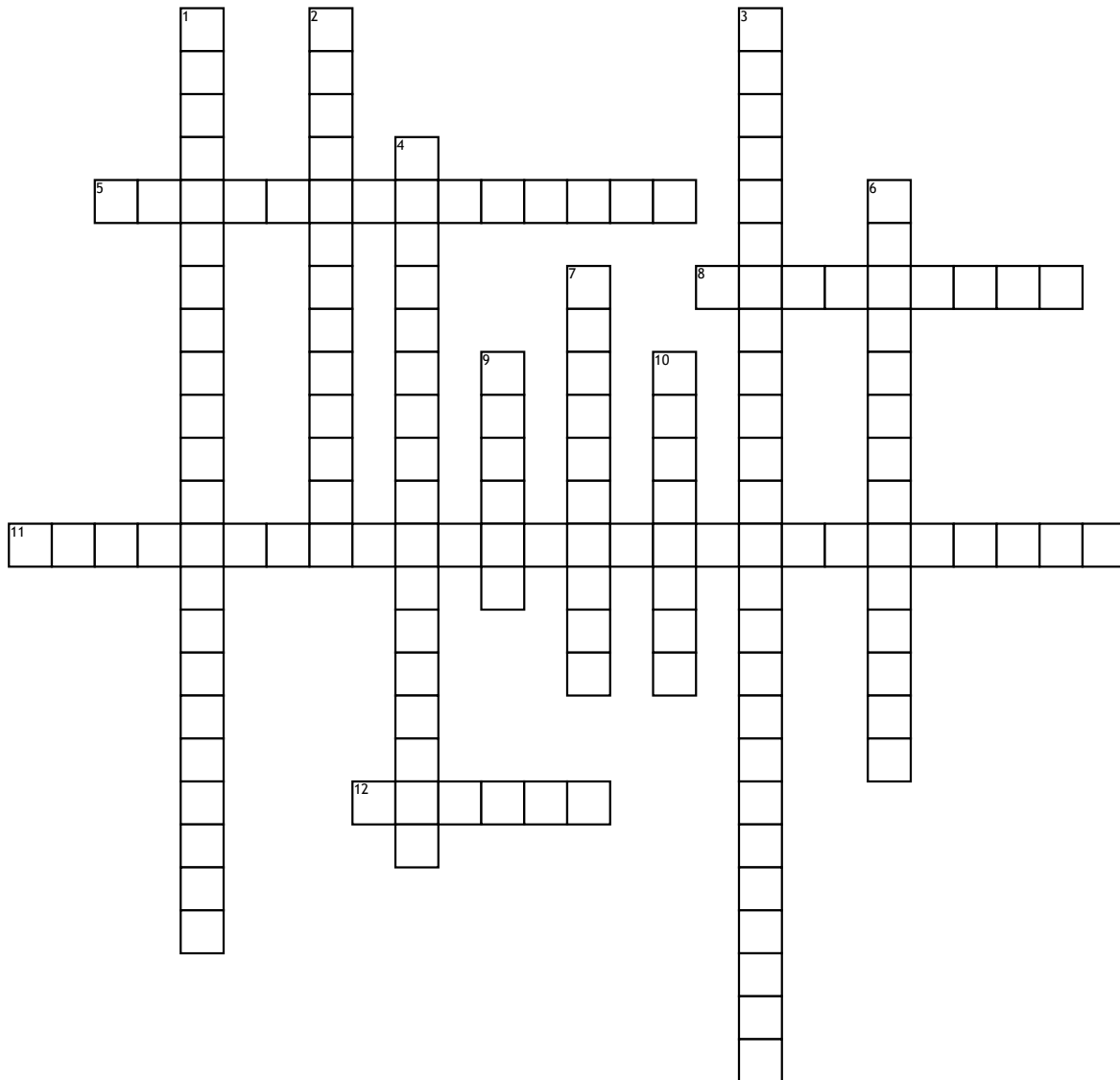


# Elements of Negligence

**1.** When the victim's actions caused all or part of the damages suffered.
