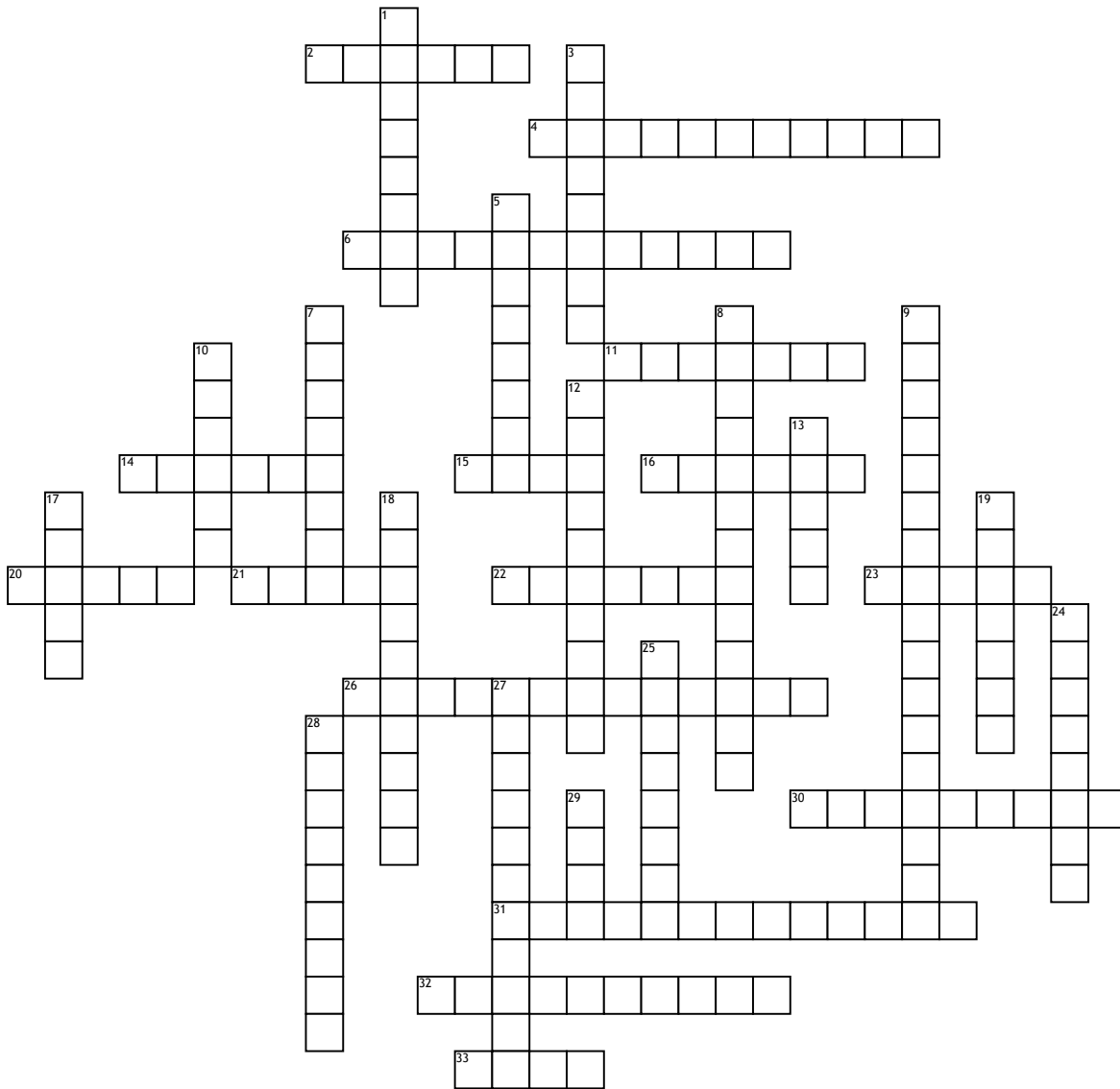


# Elements of a Story Crossword
