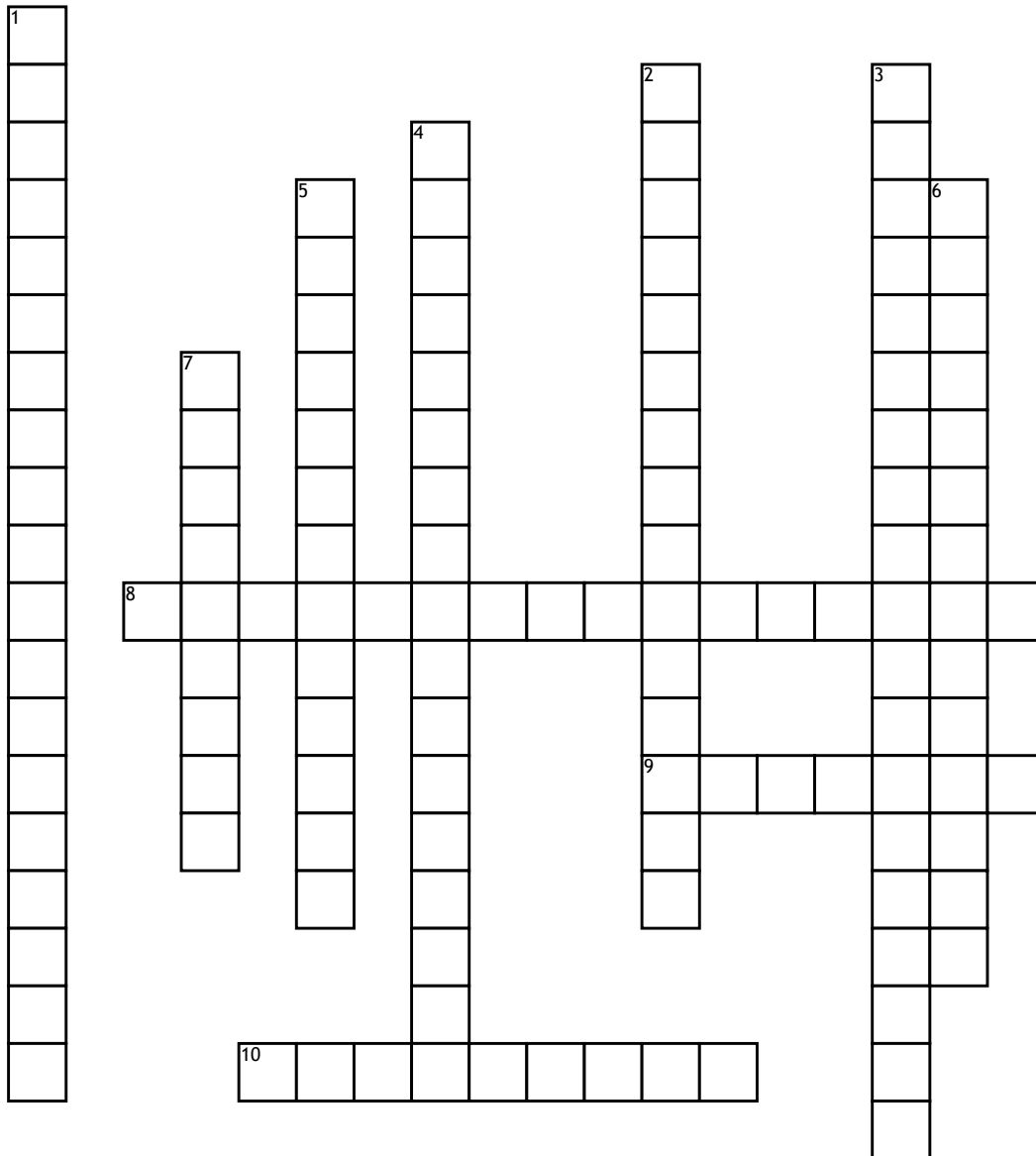

10. a machine, commonly used in attempts to detect lies, that measures several of the physiological responses accompanying emotion

1. self-perceived happiness or satisfaction with life

2. Schachter-Singer's theory that to experience emotion one must be physically aroused and cognitively label the arousal

3. the perception that one is worse off relative to those with whom one compares oneself

4. the theory that our experience of emotion is our awareness of our physiological responses to emotion-arousing stimuli

5. our tendency to form judgments relative to a neutral level defined by our prior experience

6. people's tendency to be helpful when already in a good mood

7. emotional release; catharsis hypothesis maintains that releasing aggressive energy relieves aggressive urges
