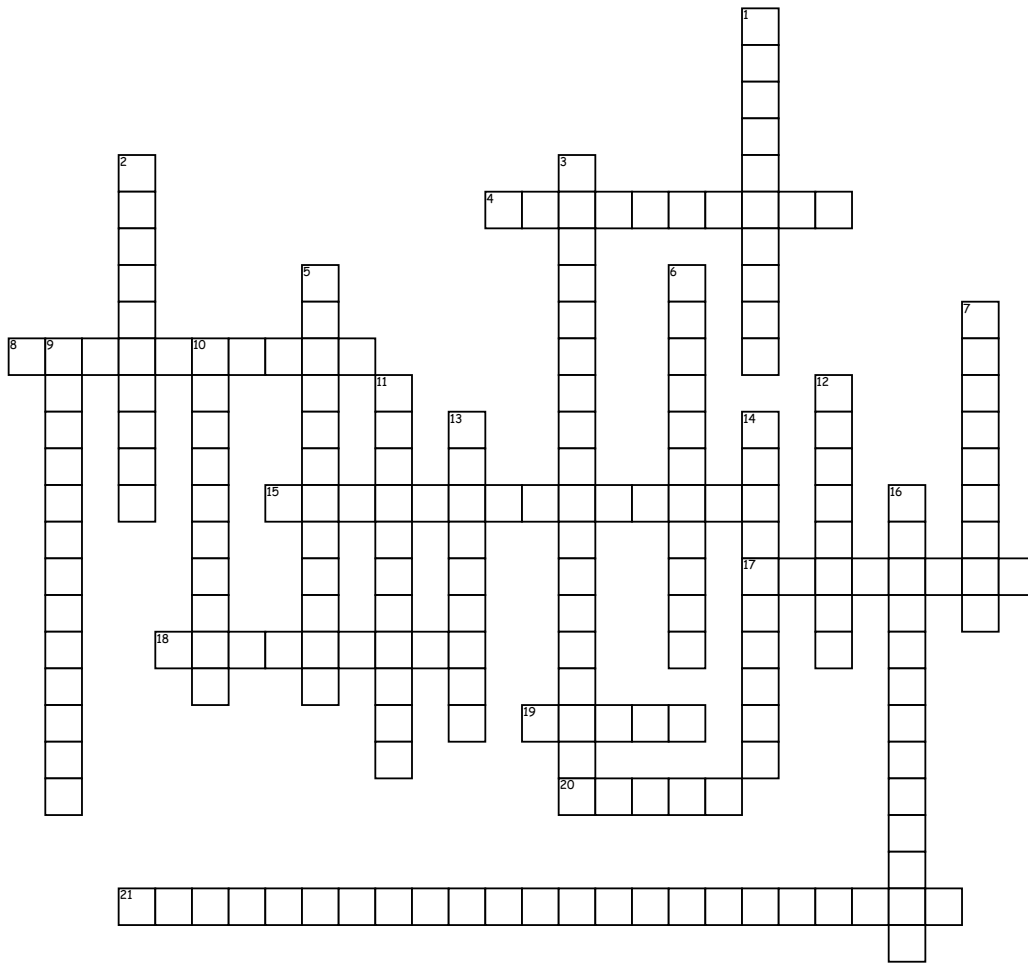


# Enlightenment crossword puzzle

- 1. The theory that all knowledge is derived from sense experience.
- 2. The study of general and fundamental Questions about Existence, knowledge, Values, reason, Mind, language
- 3. the division of governmental power among three branches: executive, legislative, and judicial, so that no single branch can become a threat to liberty
- 5. a group of thinkers in the early 1700s who believed in reason, liberty, natural law, progress, and human happiness
- 6. A belief or theory that opinions and actions should be based on reason and knowledge rather than on religious belief or emotional response
- 7. big sea monster/ argued that the absolute power of the sovereign was ultimately justified by the consent of the governed, who agreed, in a hypothetical social contract, to obey the sovereign in all matters in exchange for a guarantee of peace and security.

- 9. the time when scholars believed in the use of reason and in the scientific method (1720-1730)
- 10. an overthrow and replacement of an established government by the people governed; a sudden, complete or marked change
- 11. whatever the monarch decided was the will of God.
- 12. marked by firm determination
- 13. Willingness to accept behavior and beliefs that are different from your own
- 14. a rule or body of rules of conduct inherent in human nature and essential to or binding upon human society
- 16. Complete authority to act in an area, not restrained by supervision or review.
