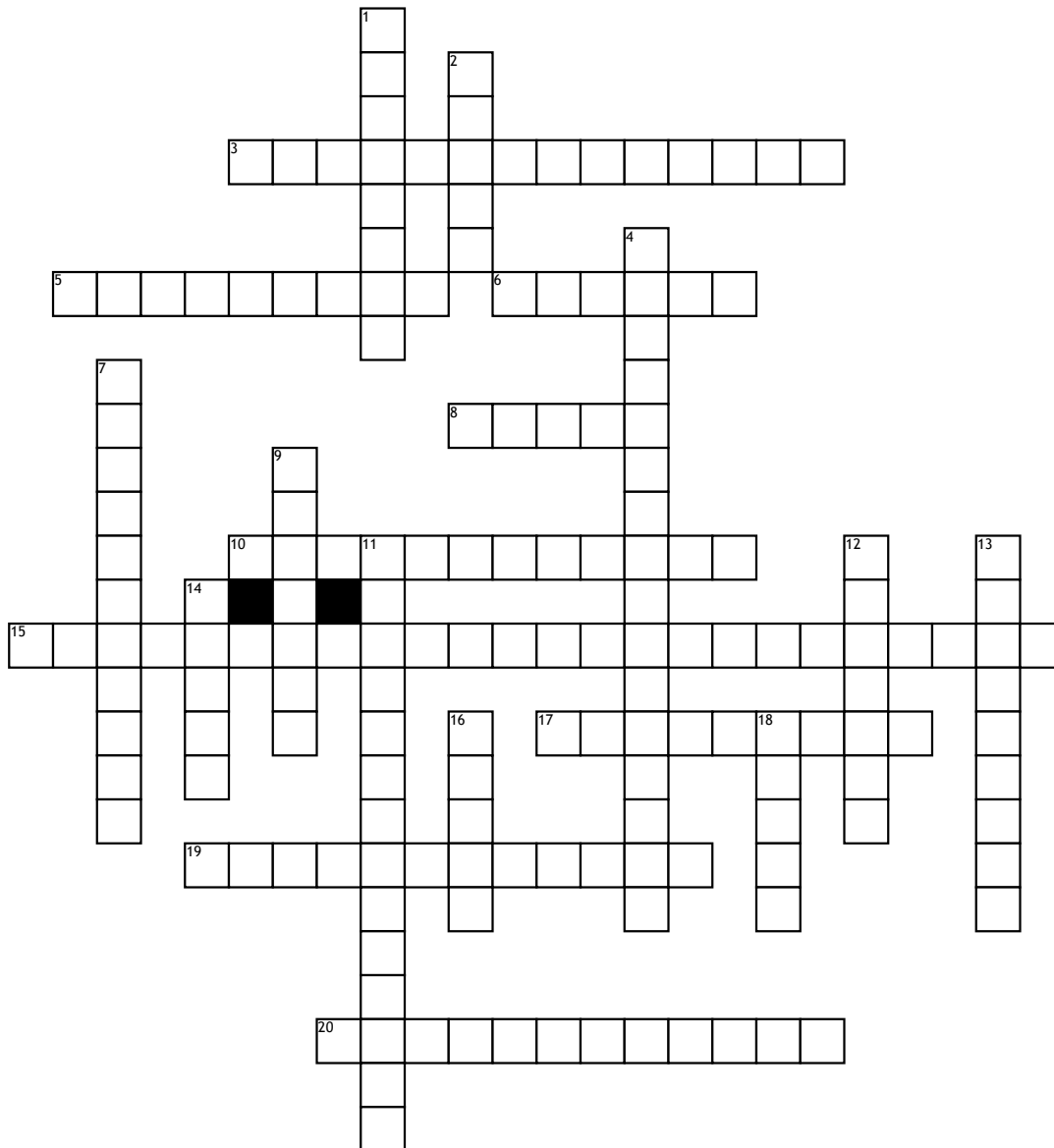

3. a strategy that aimed to reduce American involvement in the Vietnam War by transferring all military responsibilities to South Vietnam

5. A postponement of someone's conscription

10. a federal law intended to check the president's power to commit the United States to an armed conflict without the consent of the U.S. Congress.

15. was a joint resolution that the United States Congress passed on August 7, 1964, in response to the Gulf of Tonkin incident.

17. a Vietnamese Communist revolutionary leader who was Chairman and First Secretary of the Workers' Party of Vietnam. He was also Prime Minister and President of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam.

19. the theory that a political event in one country will cause similar events in neighboring countries, like a falling domino causing an entire row of upended dominoes to fall

20. was a series of surprise attacks by the Vietcong and North Vietnamese forces, on scores of cities, towns, South Vietnam.

1. the guerrilla force that, with the support of the North Vietnamese Army, fought against South Vietnam (late 1950s-1975) and the United States (early 1960s-1973).

2. an international organization for collective defense in Southeast Asia created by the Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty, or Manila Pact, signed in September 1954 in Manila, Philippines.

4. a peace treaty signed on January 27, 1973, to establish peace in Vietnam and end the Vietnam War.

7. politics or diplomacy based primarily on considerations of given circumstances and factors, rather than explicit ideological notions or moral and ethical premises.

9. A person conscripted for military service

11. the name given to a top-secret Department of Defense study of U.S. political and military involvement in Vietnam from 1945 to 196

12. the easing of strained relations, especially in a political situation, through verbal communication

13. A University students were killed and nine were injured on May 4, 1970, when members of the Ohio National Guard opened fire on a crowd gathered to protest the Vietnam War
