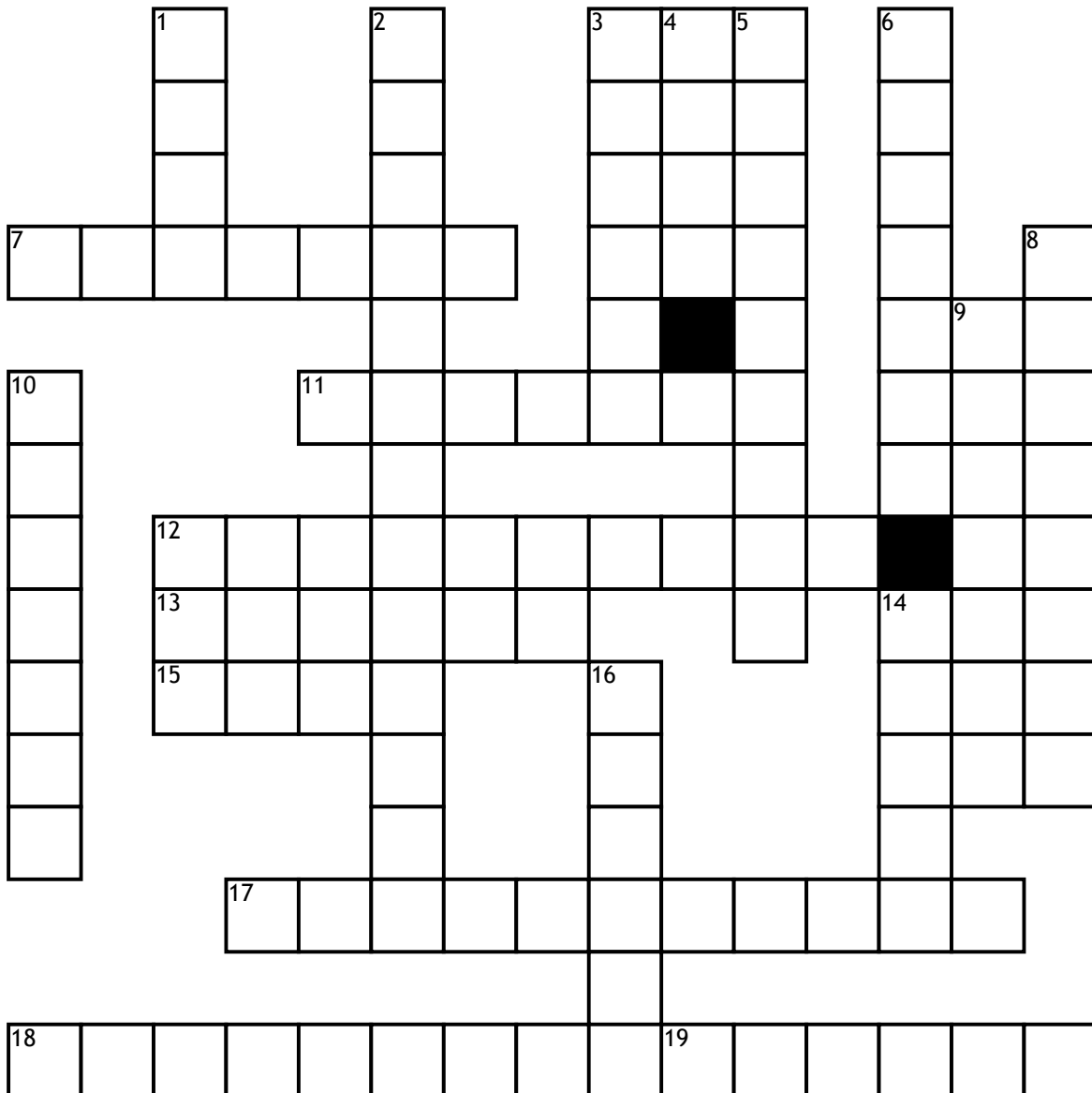

- 7. Everett's then youngest newspaper cost \$2.00 per year in advance.
- 11. In 1873, he became the City Clerk after having served as one of the town's first auditors.
- 12. In 1857, this first one was moved to the store occupied by the Whittier Brothers.
- 13. The first name of the person for whom Everett is named.
- 15. In 1892, with approval of Chapter 355 of the acts of 1892, Everett became one of these.
- 17. Now known as the Woodlawn Cemetery, this occupied about 100 acres in Everett.
- 18. The town of Everett adopted this system in 1889 for a cost then not to exceed \$50,000.

19. In 1882, the then Everett High School moved to this street.

- 1. In 1842, these names were used on a map of Everett instead of street names.
- 2. The name of Everett's first and only fire engine until 1878.
- 3. In 1874, 5 students from a class of 16 were the first graduates from this school.
- 4. The Parlin Memorial Library is named for Albert's son.
- 5. In 1883, Barnard's wife Caroline gave Everett its first ? weighing in at 900 lbs and placed in the tower of the Congregational Church.
- 6. He was Everett's first school superintendent in 1884.

- 8. In April 1892, Eagle Bank issued its one thousandth of these for deposits.
- 9. 36 people were present at the first session when this religious school opened in 1847.
- 10. This doctor was postmaster in 1872, a founder of the public library and a trustee of Glenwood cemetery.
- 14. With the city of Charlestown providing and maintaining the infrastructure, this was introduced in Everett in 1872 at a cost of about \$84,000.
