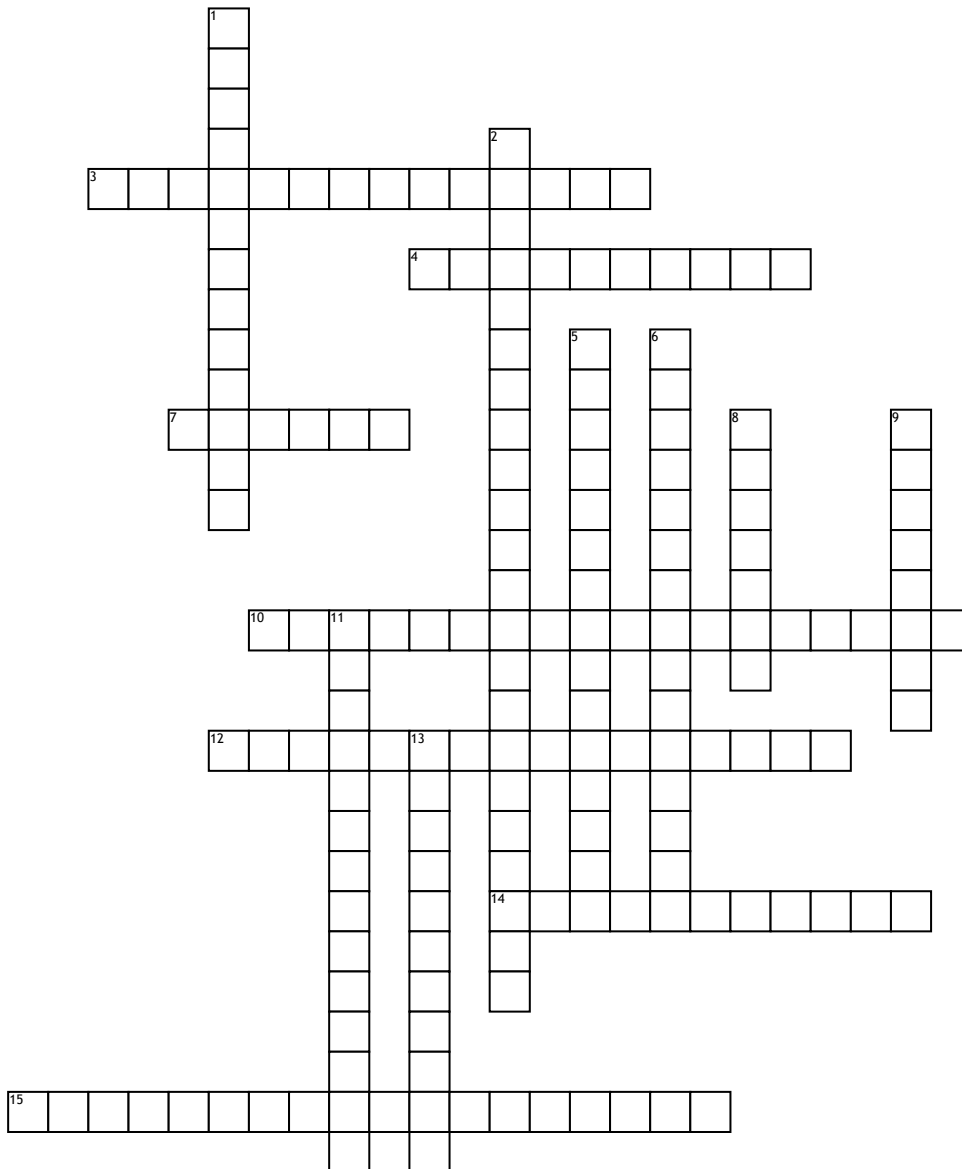


Executive Branch

3. is the highest-ranking executive in a company, and their primary responsibilities include making major corporate decisions, managing the overall operations and resources of a company, and acting as the main point of communication between the board of directors and corporate operations

4. establishes the executive branch of the federal government, which carries out and enforces federal laws

7. to use the executive power of a Governor or President to forgive a person convicted of a crime, thus removing any remaining penalties or punishments and preventing any new prosecution of the person for the crime

10. an international agreement, usually regarding routine administrative matters not warranting a formal treaty, made by the executive branch of the US government without ratification by the Senate

12. a body of people representing the states of the US, who formally cast votes for the election of the president and vice president

14. A job of the executive branch to remind the citizens of the laws created

15. the privilege, claimed by the president for the executive branch of the US government, of withholding information in the public interest

1. limited to registered party members, who must declare their party affiliation in order to vote

2. yearly address delivered each January by the president of the US to Congress, giving the administration's view of the state of the nation and plans for legislation

5. a head of state or officer in supreme command of a country's armed forces

6. A role of the president in which he is in charge of enforcing and passing laws

8. a body of advisers to the president, composed of the heads of the executive departments of the government

9. The elected executive head of a state of the US

11. a rule or order issued by the president to an executive branch of the government and having the force of law

13. a primary election in which voters are not required to declare party affiliation
