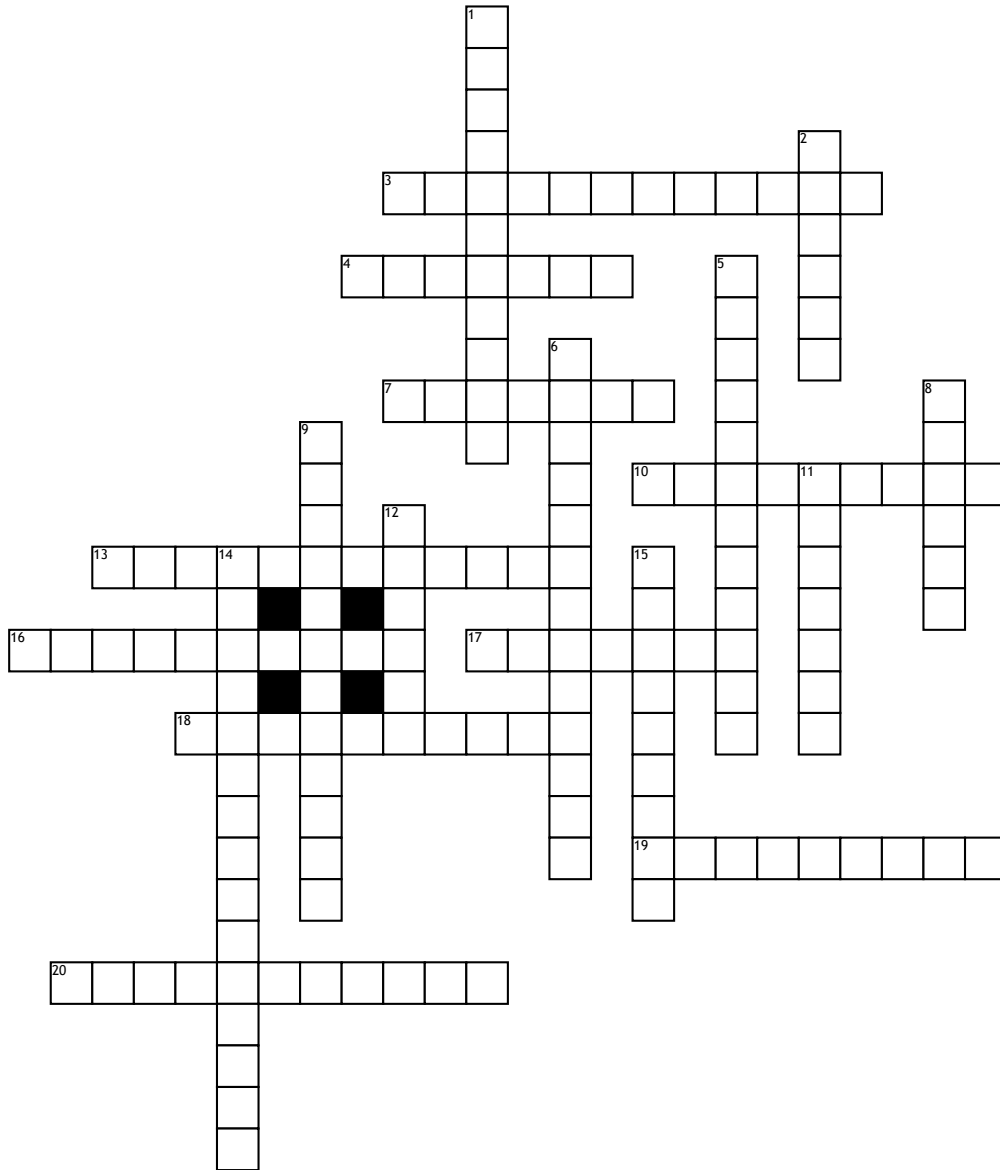

- 6. the sea journey undertaken by slave ships from West Africa to the West Indies

- 9. 17th century economic belief that a country's prosperity depended on having a large supply of gold and silver
- 11. a person of mixed European and black descent, especially in the Caribbean

- 14. a multilateral system of trading in which a country pays for its imports from one country by its exports to another
- 15. an instrument formerly used to make astronomical measurements, typically of the altitudes of celestial bodies, and in navigation for calculating latitude, before the development of the sextant
