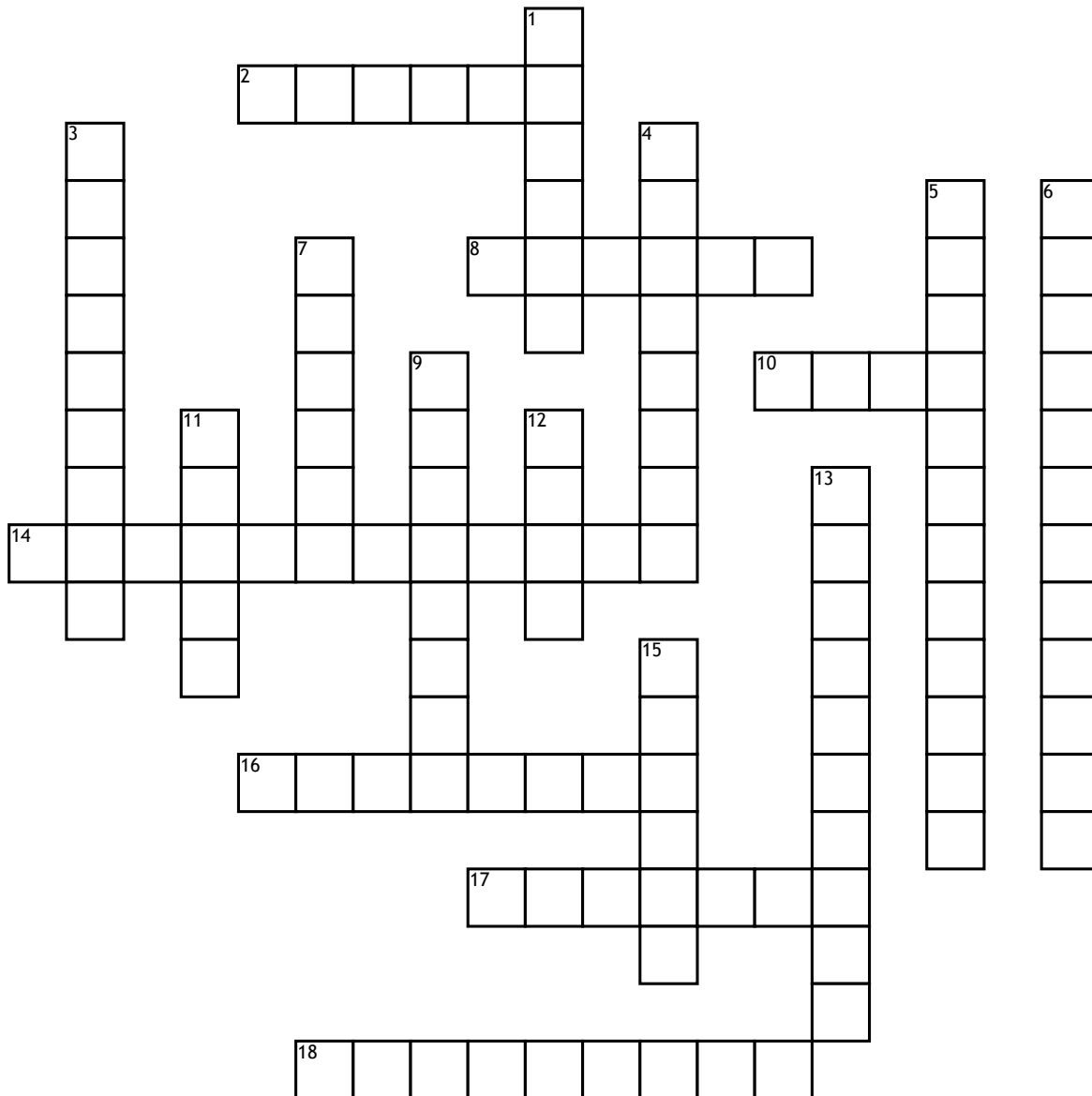


Figurative Language

2. A group of lines arranged together.

8. A poem that expresses the feelings or thoughts of a speaker rather than telling a story

10. The appearance of the words on the page

14. This is the repetition of initial consonant sounds at the beginnings of words.

16. This is the repetition of similar sounds that comes at the ends of lines of poetry.

17. A sound, word, phrase or line repeated regularly in a poem.

18. Repeated VOWEL sounds in a line or lines of poetry.

1. This is a rhymed, songlike poem that tells a story, often dealing with adventure or romance.

3. Exaggeration often used for emphasis

4. an expression designed to call something to mind without mentioning it explicitly; an indirect or passing reference.

5. Words that imitate the sound they are naming

6. This refers to the feelings and associations that go beyond the dictionary definition of a word.

7. An eight line stanza

9. A direct comparison of two unlike things

11. A Japanese poem written in three lines

12. This type of poem is very long and usually relates the adventures of a legendary character or a national history. It is often passed down orally before being written.

13. Repeated consonant sounds in lines of poetry

15. A type of literature that expresses ideas, feelings, or tells a story in a specific form (usually using lines and stanzas)
