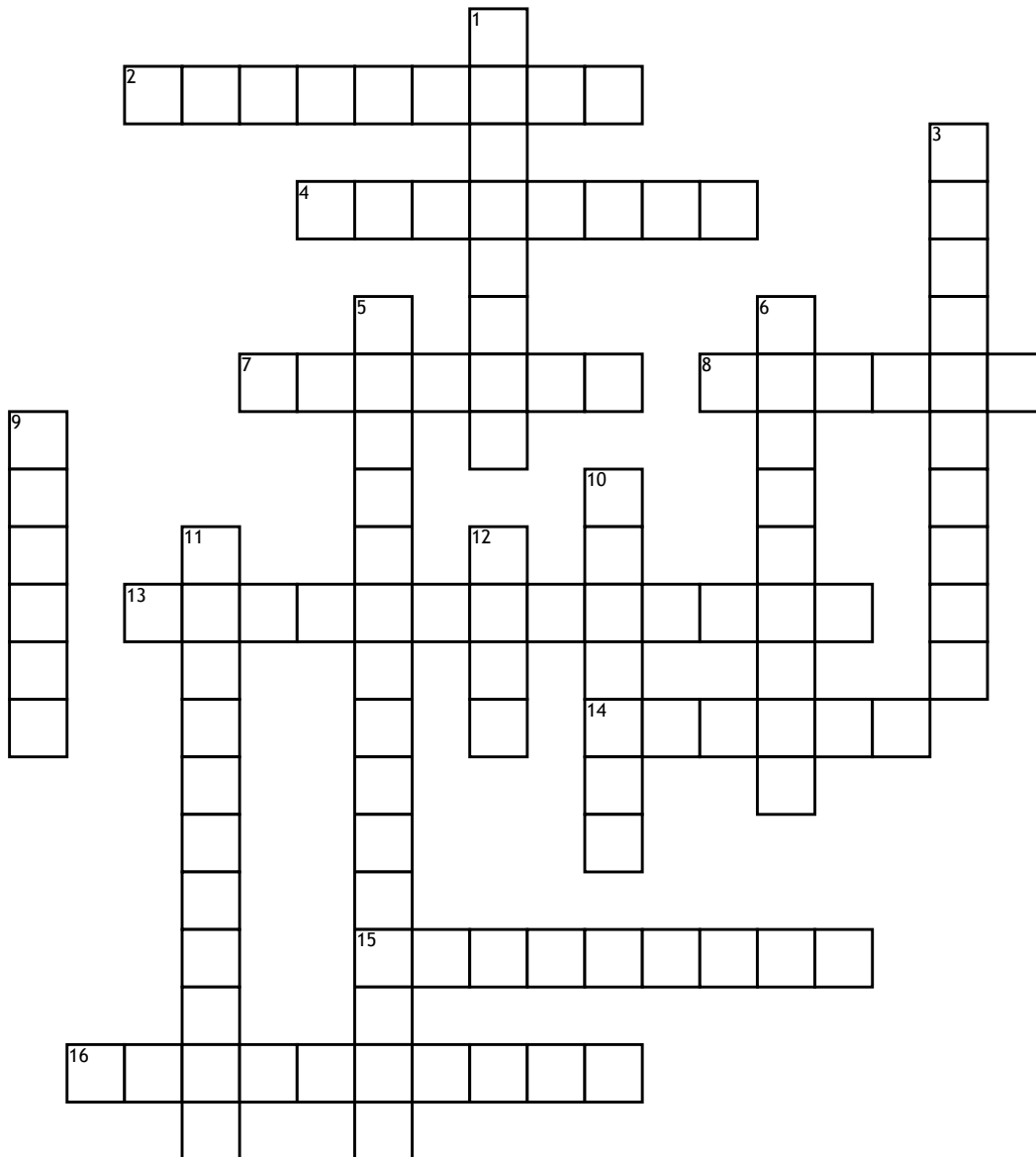

2. Canted angle, or oblique angle, is a type of camera shot which involves setting the camera at an angle on its roll axis

4. A lens of variable focal length which permits the cameraman to change from wide angle to telephoto shots (and vice versa) in one continuous movement.
