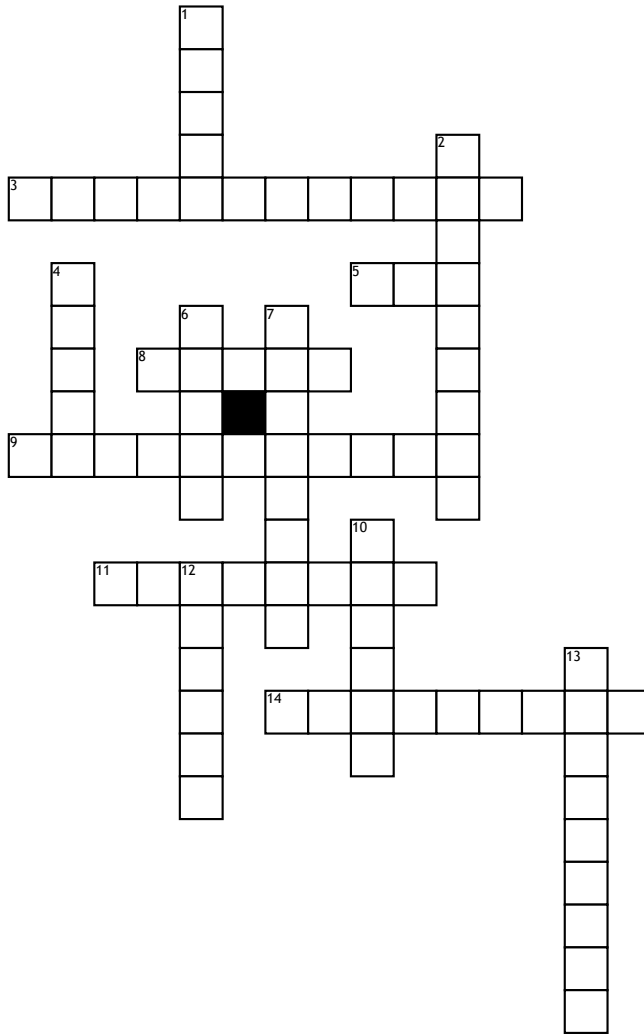


# Flood
