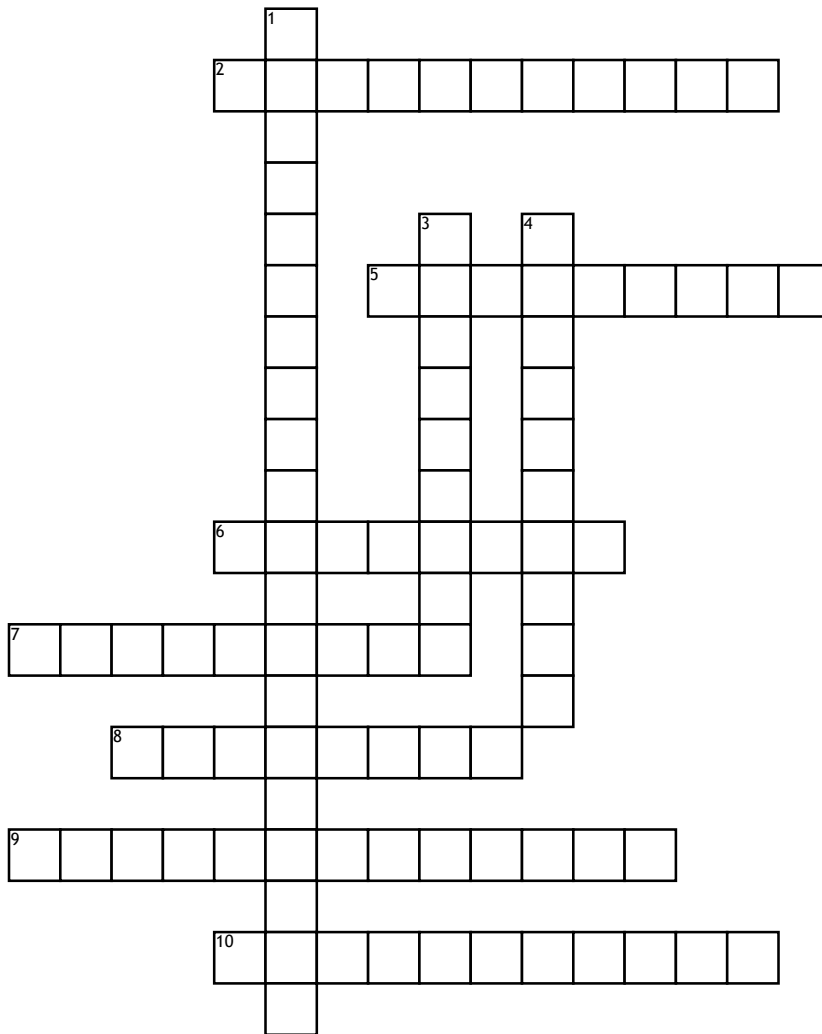

- 7. The palace in Paris in which King Louis XVI and his family were placed under house arrest after they were forcibly taken from their court at Versailles.
- 8. The form of government, common to most European countries at the time of the French Revolution,
- 9. A series of decrees issued by the National Assembly in August 1789 that successfully suppressed the Great Fear by releasing all peasants from feudal contracts.
