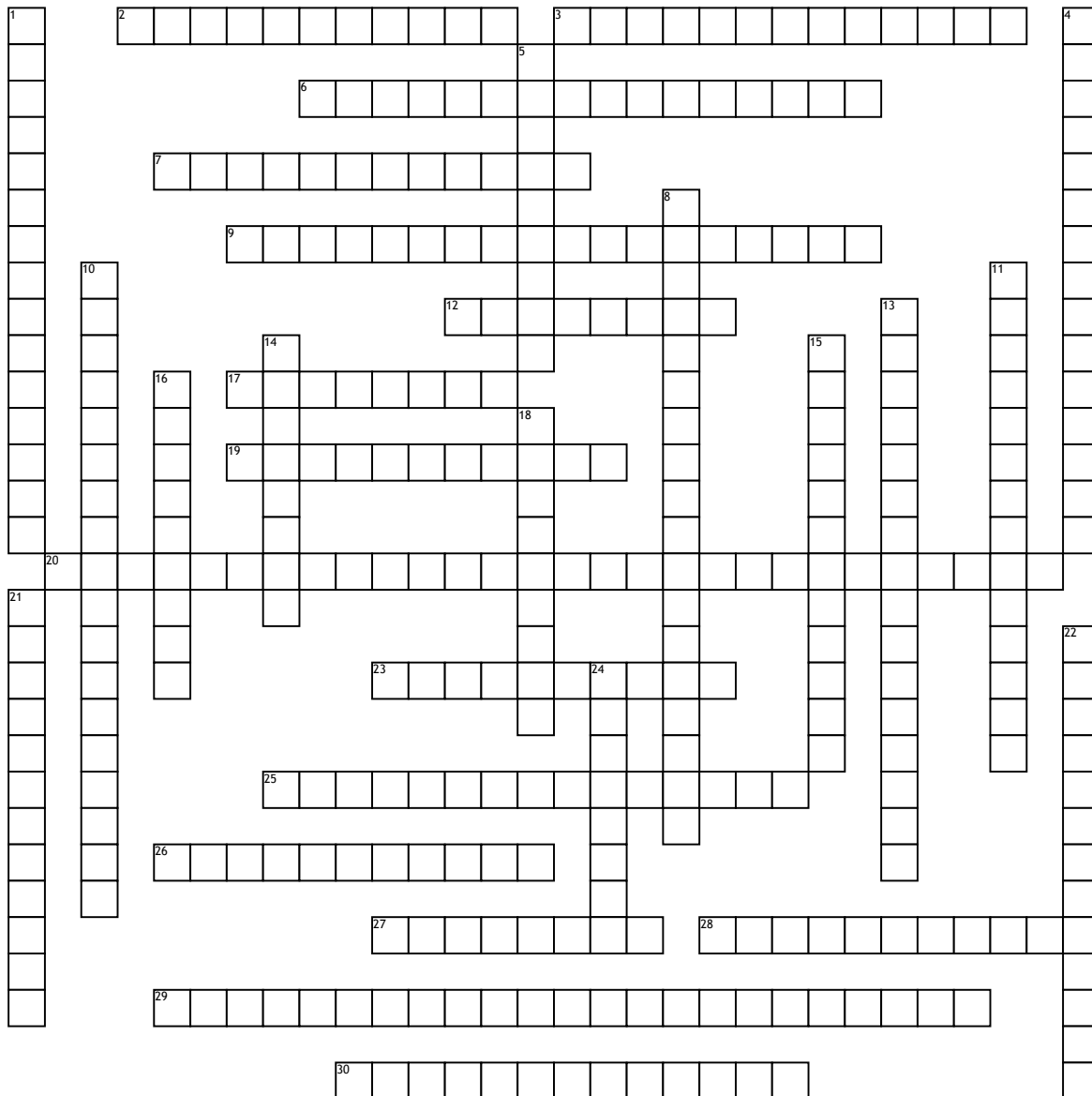

2. The middle class
 3. Time period that emphasized the rights of the individual, democracy, etc; helped spark the French Revolution
 6. The period after the end of the war that finally recognized the Declaration of the Rights of Man and the Citizen; named by Robespierre
 7. Members of the Paris Commune that thought of themselves as ordinary patriots; meaning without-breeches in english
 9. The first written, yet short lived constitution in France
 12. A political group of the National Convention that tended to represent people outside of Paris; feared radical mobs of Paris
 17. French armory and prison that the Parisians stormed on July 14, 1789
 19. The unofficial leader of the Committee of public safety
 20. Said that bishops and priests were to be elected by the people
 23. The meeting place of the Estate General and King Louis XVI's palace
 25. The Queen of France at the time and Louis XVI's wife
 26. The clergy (cardinals, bishops, and monks); highest order in the estate general

27. A political group of the National Convention that represented the radicals of Paris
 28. Lower and middle class; lowest order of the estate general
 29. A committee of 12 that was made to combat the crises threatening France; it essentially took over the government
 30. Assembly of representatives from the top class, higher class, middle class, and lower class

 1. The superior council set up by the constitution of 1795; accepted or rejected proposed laws
 4. The oath the third estate took to draft a new constitution; named after their meeting place
 5. The executive branch of the government created after the execution of Robespierre
 8. A decree made to raise an army due to the constant threat of invasion
 10. A movement where christianity was began to be seen as superstitious and many measures were taken such as a new calendar and repurposing the cathedral of Notre Dame
 11. One of the main writers of the Declaration of the Rights of Woman and the Female Citizen
 13. A group of former third estate representatives that wanted to draft a new constitution
 14. A popular French general that overthrew the Directory very quickly

15. The nobility (held high positions in government and military); second highest order in the estate general)
 16. The people of Paris
 18. A time period where word got out to the villages that foreign troops were on there way causing constant paranoia and peasant rebellions
 21. The popularly run city council of Paris that attacked the royal palace and legislative assembly
 22. A time period where many temporary courts were set up to prosecute counterrevolutionaries and traitors; 40,000 people were killed including Mary Antionette and Olympe de Gouges
