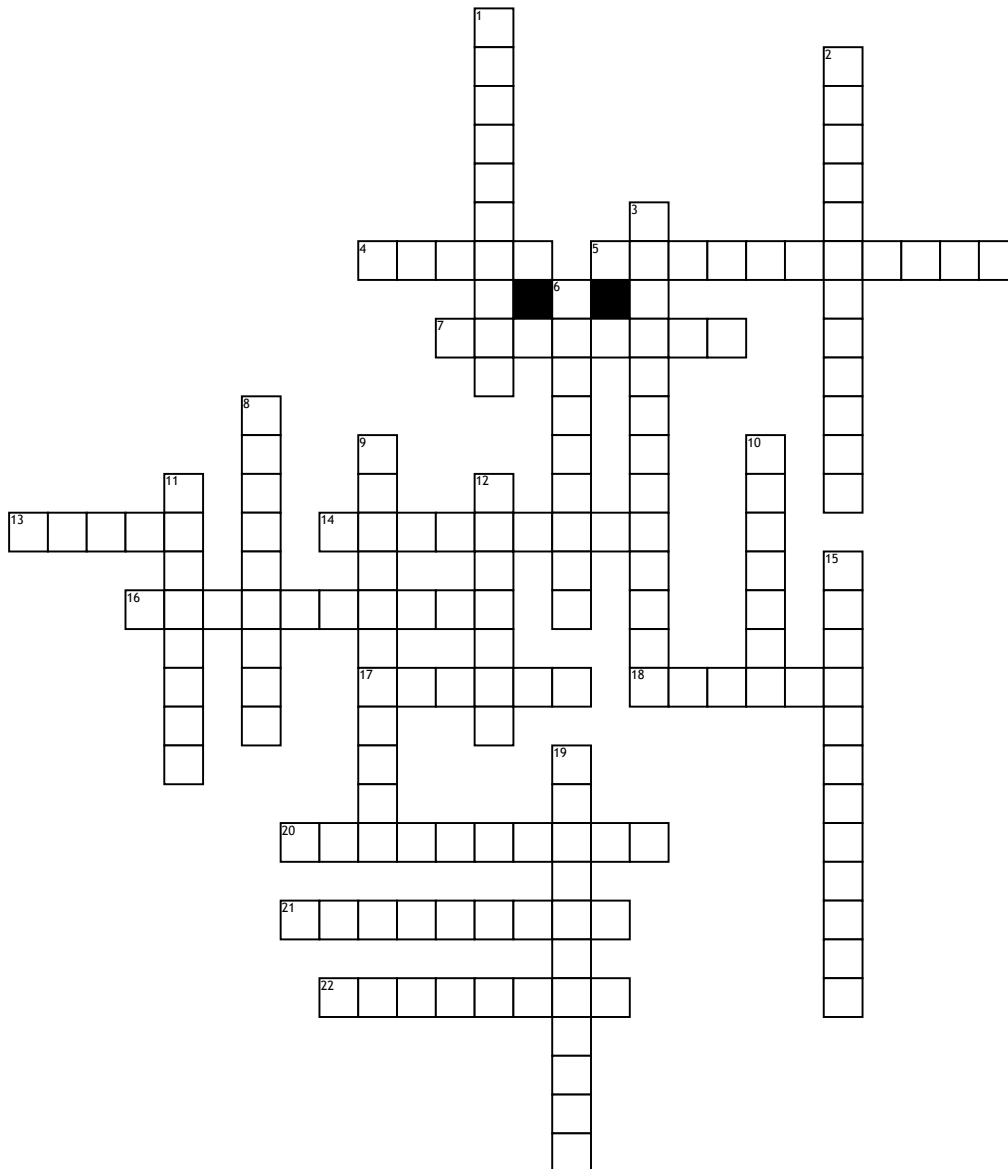


Gastro-Intestinal system

4. severe pain in the abdomen caused by wind or obstruction in the intestines and suffered especially by babies
5. White patches; may be hyperkeratotic; usually in buccal mucosa; usually painless
7. an involuntary spasm of the diaphragm and respiratory organs, with a sudden closure of the glottis and a characteristic gulping sound.
13. mixture of food with saliva, salivary enzymes, and gastric secretions that is produced as the food passes through the mouth, esophagus, and stomach
14. indigestion
16. dry mouth and dry mouth syndrome, dryness in the mouth, which may be associated with a change in the composition of saliva, or reduced salivary flow,

17. protrusion of an organ or part of an organ through the wall of the cavity that normally contains it

18. a feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit

20. the accumulation of gas in the alimentary canal

21. difficulty swallowing

22. lack of loss of appetite for food

1. inflammation of the oral mucosa

2. the scientific term for tooth decay or cavities

3. A backward flowing. For example, vomiting is a of food from the stomach, and the backflow of blood back into the heart when a heart valve is incompetent

6. absent or ineffective peristalsis (wavelike contraction) of the distal esophagus accompanied by failure of the esophageal sphincter to relax in response to swallowing

8. Bad breath

9. painful swallowing. Pain can be felt in your mouth, throat, or esophagus.

10. heartburn

11. spasms of the anal sphincter with pain and persistent urge to defecate

12. the production of dark sticky faeces containing partly digested blood, as a result of internal bleeding or the swallowing of blood.

15. the excretion of abnormal quantities of fat with the faeces owing to reduced absorption of fat by the intestine

19. Cheesy white plaque that looks like milk curds; when rubbed off, it leaves an erythematous and often bleeding base
