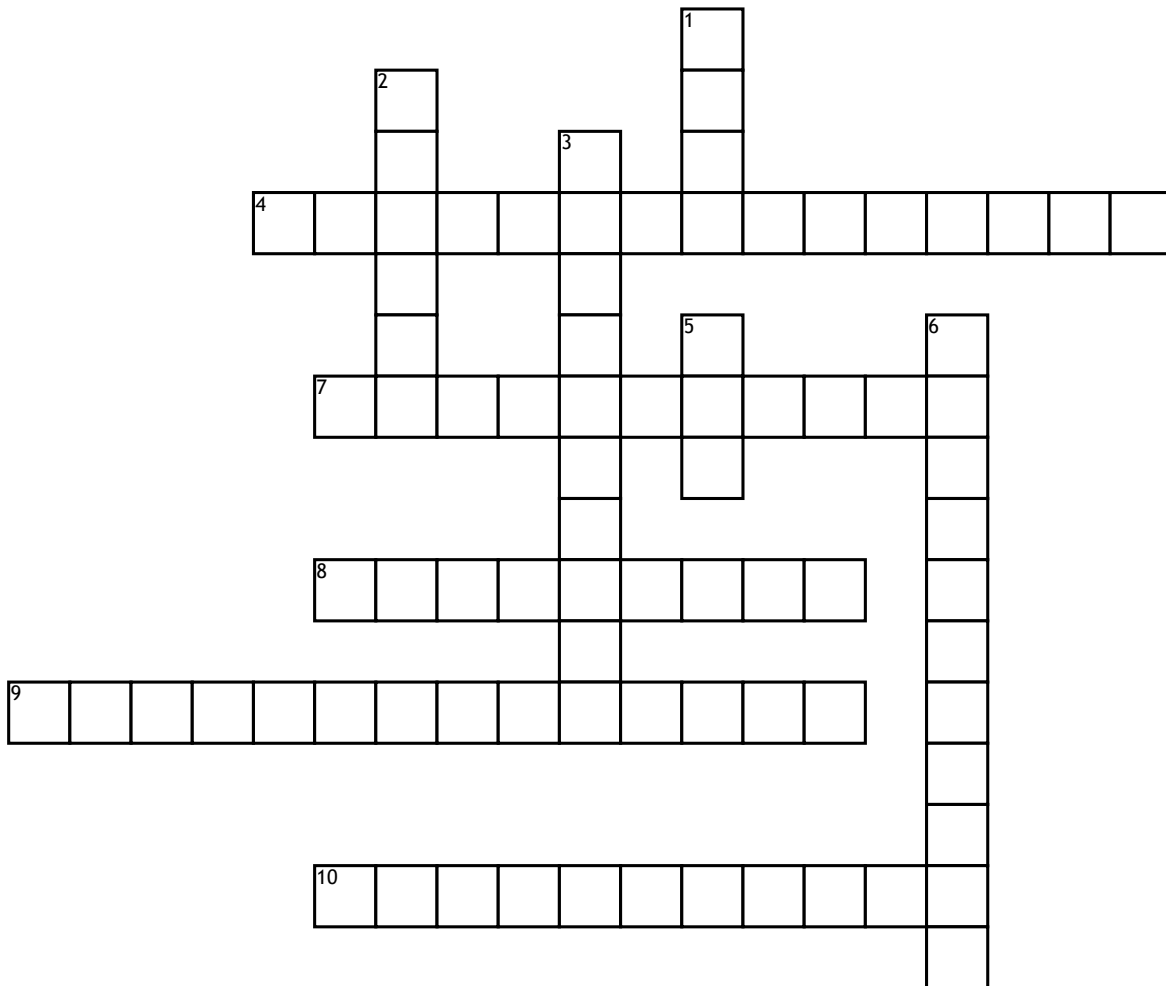


Gender Identity Terms

4. Anxiety and/or discomfort regarding one's sex assigned at birth.
7. An encompassing term of many gender identities of those who do not identify or exclusively identify with their sex assigned at birth.
8. Preferred umbrella term for all genders other than female/male or woman/man, used as an adjective (e.g. Jesse is a nonbinary person).
9. One's internal sense of being male, female, neither of these, both, or other gender(s).
10. Systemic violence against trans people, associated with attitudes such as fear, discomfort, distrust, or disdain. This word is used similarly to homophobia, xenophobia, misogyny, etc.

1. Someone who advocates and supports a community other than their own.
2. A set of cultural constructs describing characteristics that may historically be related to femininity, masculinity, women, men, nonbinary people, or social norms.
3. A person's process of developing and assuming a gender expression to match their gender identity.
5. A set of characteristics associated with reproduction and biology that generally assign individuals into categories of "male" and "female."
6. A deprecated term that is often considered pejorative similar to transgender in that it indicates a difference between one's gender identity and sex assigned at birth.
