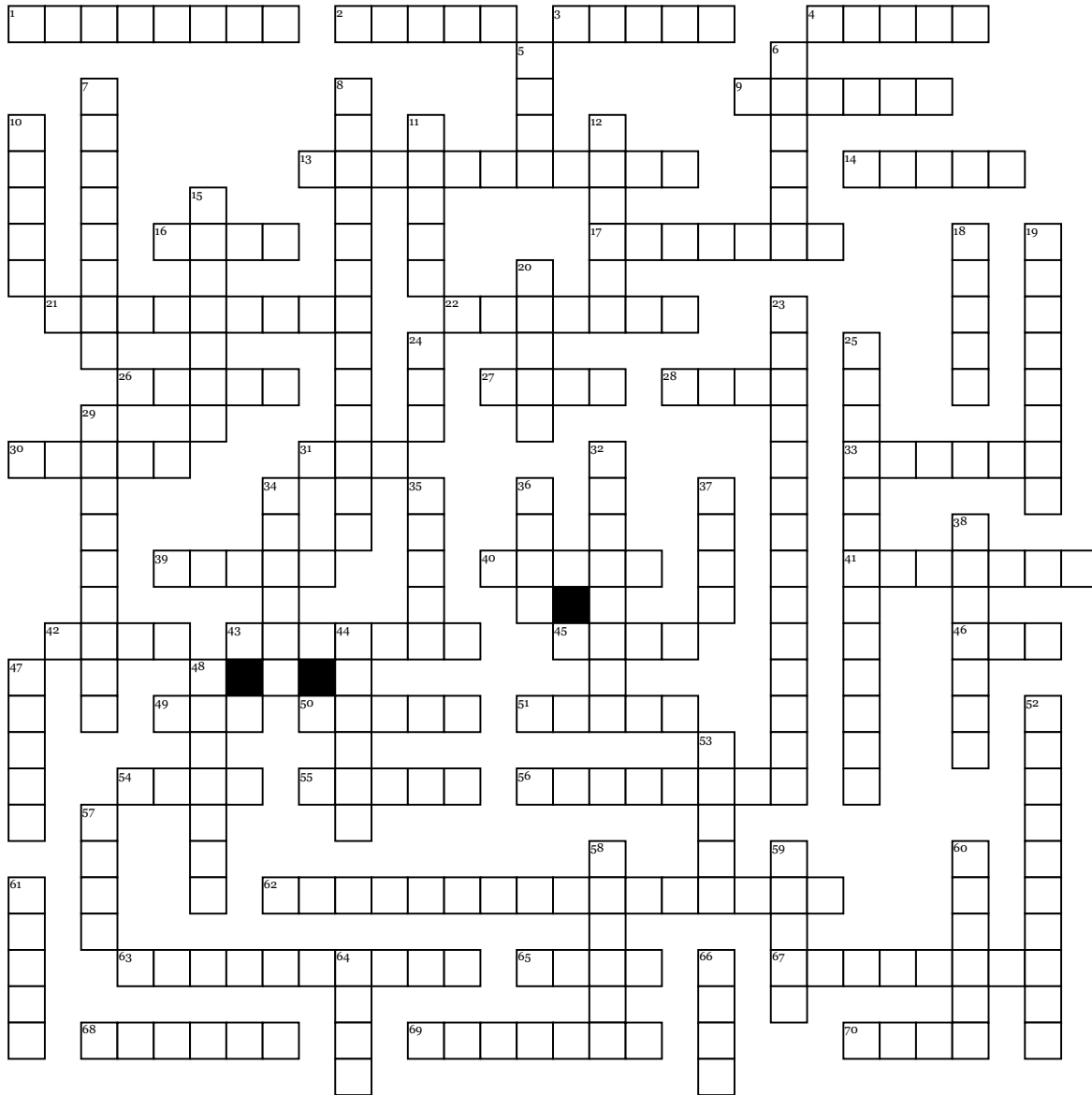


# Geo Terms Crossword



## Across

1. a rock that breaks the waves; a wave that breaks against a rock, a sand bank, or the shore, exhibiting a white foam
2. a small natural stream of water, a current flowing from a spring
3. a wood of small extent
4. a piece of land enclosed for tillage or pasture
9. a smaller stream running into a larger one or proceeding from it
13. a body of water interspersed with many isles
14. a narrow hollow with steep, rocky sides worn by a stream or torrent of water
16. a place in a river or other water where it may be passed by man or beast on foot or by wading
17. an arm of the sea; the mouth of a river or lake where the tide meets the current
21. a great extent of land, not disjoined or interrupted by a sea
22. an arm of the sea; a straight or narrow sea between two continents or between a continent and an isle
26. a ring-shaped coral reef, island, or set of small islands nearly or completely surrounding a lagoon
27. a hollow place in the earth; a subterranean cavern; a den; may be natural or artificial
28. a small vale with woods
30. a small, narrow hollow with steep walls worn by a stream or torrent of water
31. a bank or mound of earth; any wall or a frame of wood raised to obstruct a current of water
33. a tract of land surrounded by water
39. a long, narrow, deep valley formed by glacial erosion and flooded by ocean water
40. an area of triangular shaped land located at the mouth of a main river from which distributaries flow
41. a field or an immense mass of ice formed in deep but elevated valleys, remaining frozen throughout the heat of summer
42. a ditch, a mound of earth, stones, or other materials, intended to prevent low lands from being inundated by the sea or a river
43. a neck or narrow slip of land by which two continents are connected or by which a peninsula is united to the mainland

45. a natural elevation of land, a mass of earth rising above the common level of the surrounding land

46. an arm of the sea, extending into the land, smaller than a gulf and larger than a creek
49. soft, wet ground covered with grass or other plants, too soft to bear a man
50. a small inlet; a recess in the shore of the sea or of a river; a small stream
51. a bay or recess in the shore of the sea, a lake, or a large river; a narrow body of water between isles
54. hill, mound, or ridge of sand formed by wind
55. the edge or margin of the land next to the sea; the seashore
56. a cape; a promontory; a point of land projecting from the shore into the sea or other expanse of water

36. a valley, a dale, a depression or space between hills
37. a steep slope of ground rising from a lake, a river, or the sea
38. a hill or mountain of ice; a vast body of ice accumulated in valleys in high northern latitudes
44. a port or haven for ships; a bay or inlet of the sea where ships can moor
47. the edge, margin, or border of a steep place, as of a precipice or the bank of a river
48. any tract of land or inhabited land; any region, as distinguished from other regions; a kingdom, state, or lesser district
52. the direction a river flows, flowing with the current
53. the terraqueous globe that we inhabit
57. a recess in the ocean from the general line of the shore into the land, a tract of water extending from the ocean or a sea into the land between two points or promontories; a large bay
58. a long deep hollow with steep, rocky sides worn by a stream or torrent of water
59. a high, steep almost vertical rock, usually on a coast
60. a ridge that determines the direction water drains for adjacent water systems; a watershed
61. the shore of the sea or of a lake, washed by the tide and waves
64. a steep, rugged rock; a tough, broken rock or point of a rock
66. a head land; the head, point, or termination of a neck of land, extending some distance into the sea beyond the common shore
