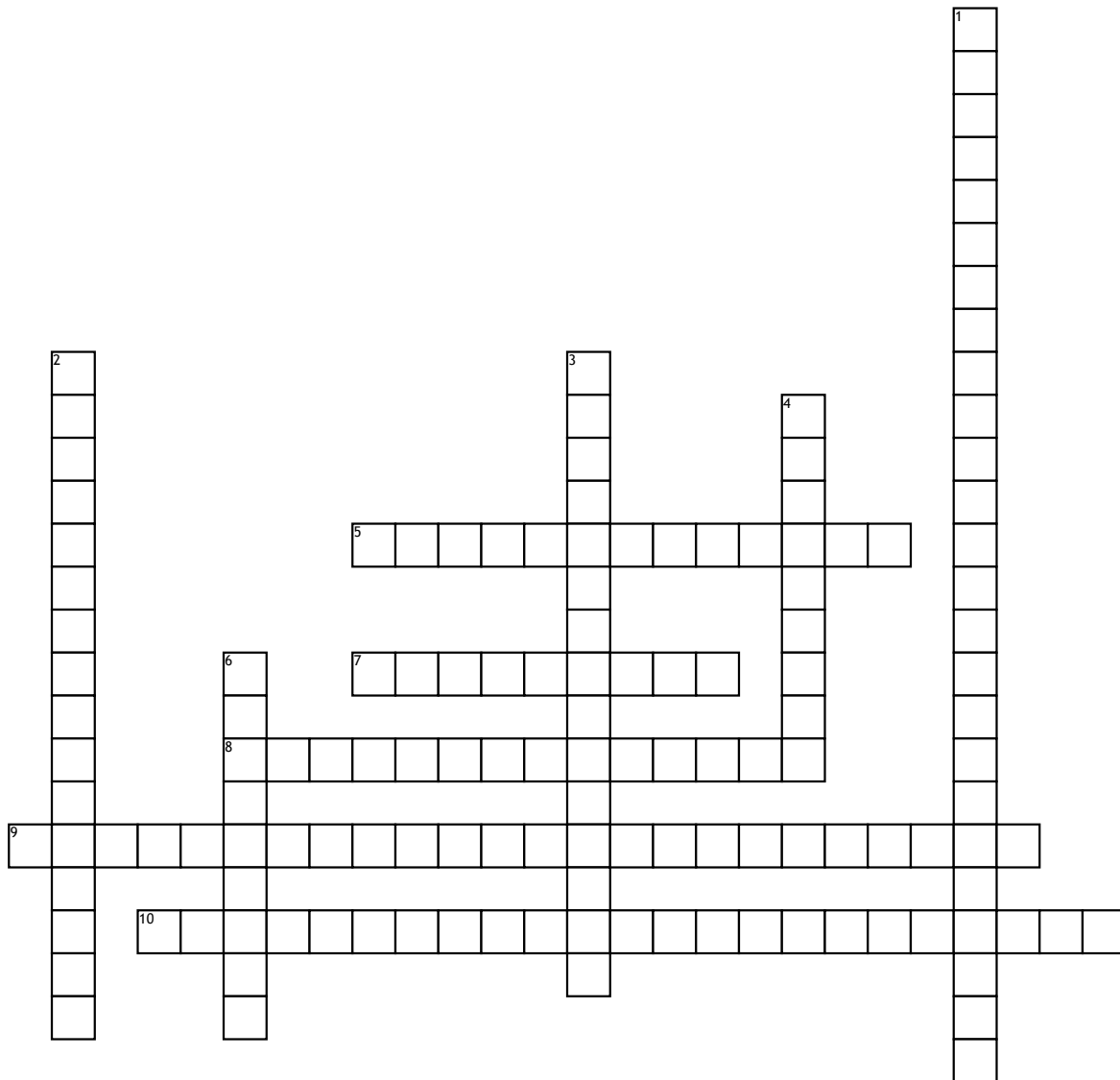

5. Three common types of regions are formal regions, which are defined formally by government or other structures, such as cities, states, and mountain ranges; functional regions
7. is a political and economic system in which the major productive resources in a society—such as mines, factories, and farms—are owned by the public or the state, and wealth is divided among citizens equally or according to individual need.
8. A cotton mill is a factory housing powered spinning or weaving machinery for the production of yarn or cloth
9. typically refers to the service sector;
10. The primary sector includes the production of raw material and basic foods. Activities associated with the primary sector include agriculture (both subsistence and commercial), mining, forestry, farming, grazing, hunting and gathering, fishing, and quarrying.

1. involve the processing of raw materials (primary products). Examples would include turning timber into furniture and turning iron-ore into steel
