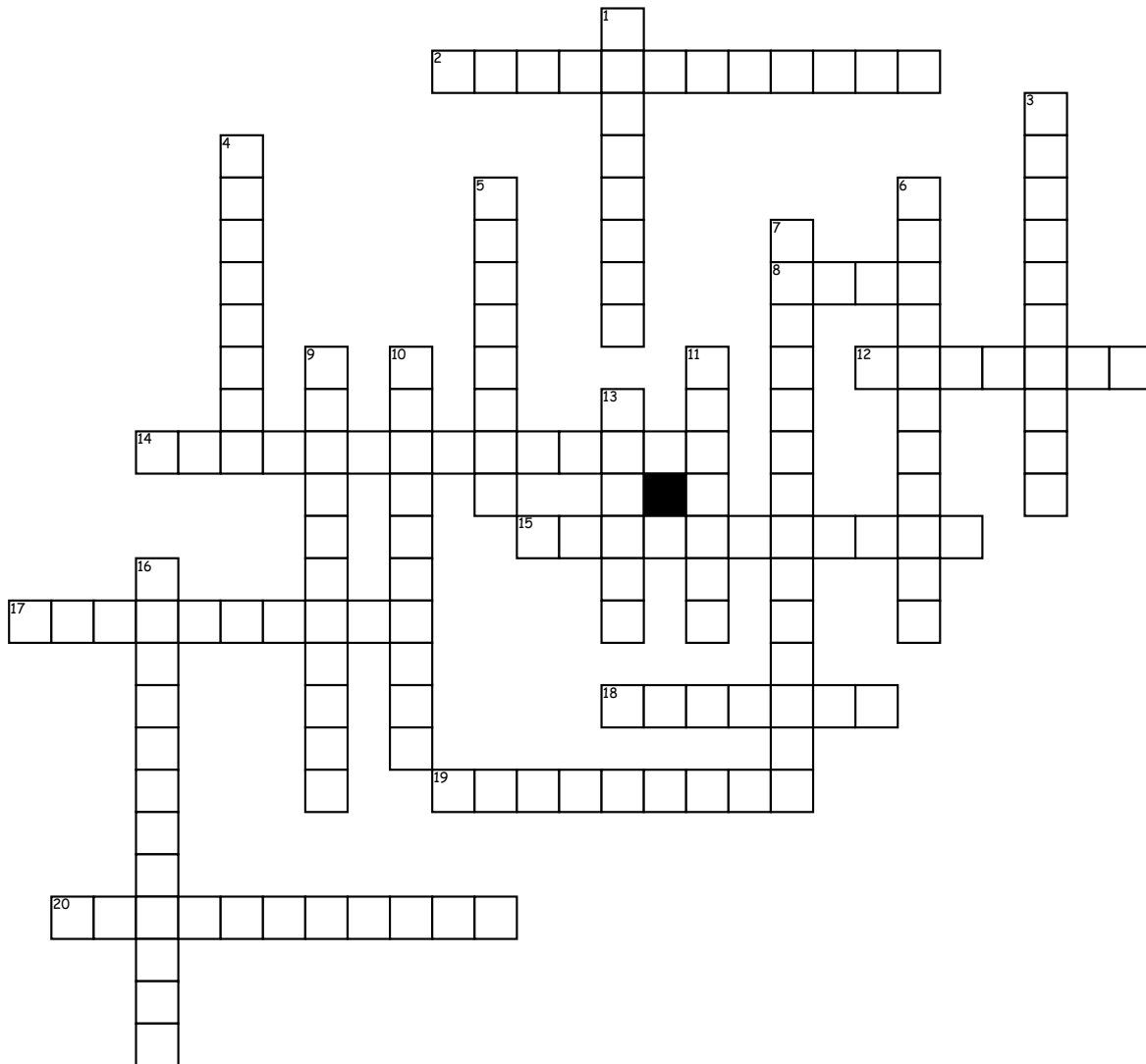


Georgia Becomes A Colony
