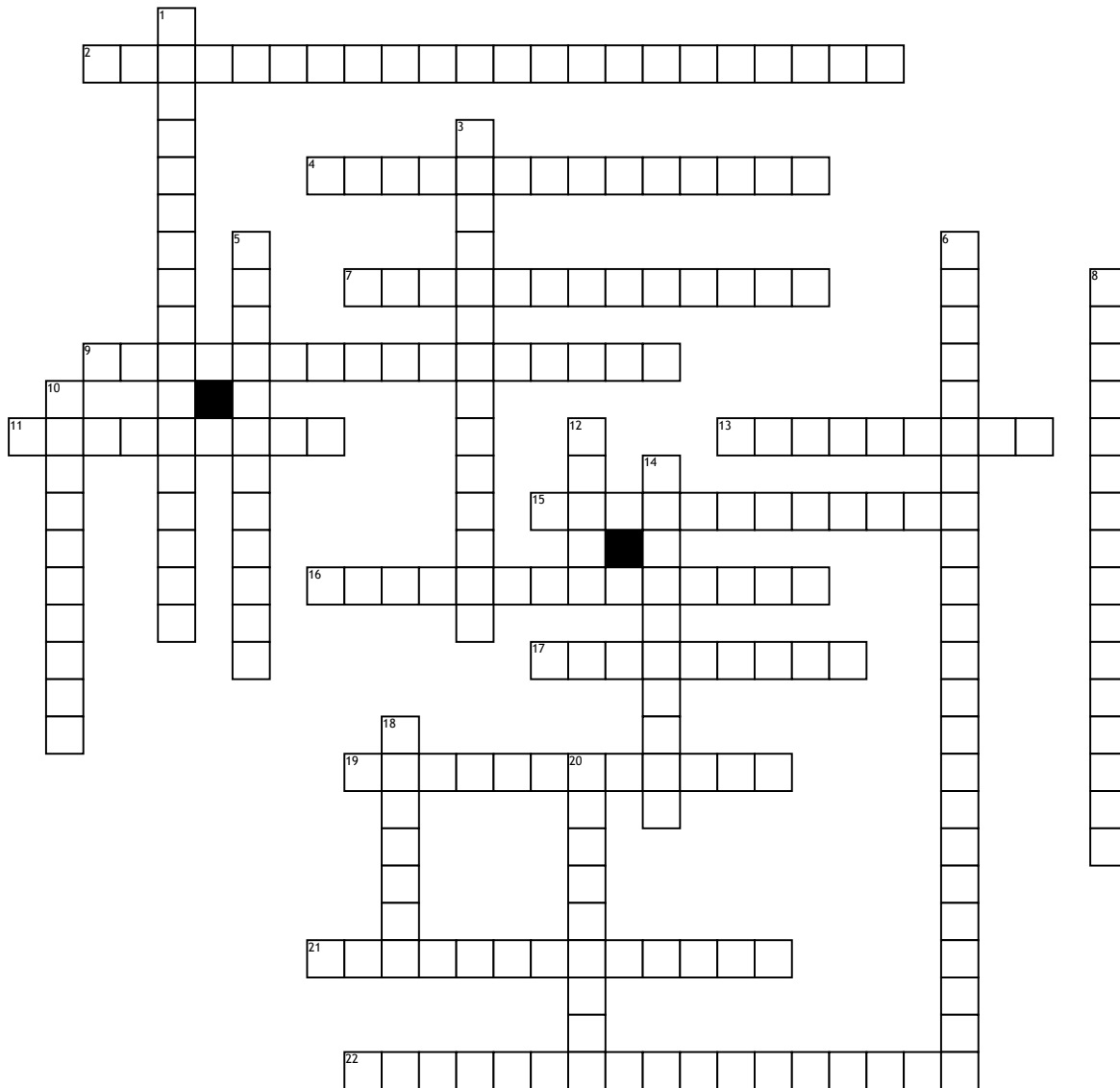


# Government crossword
