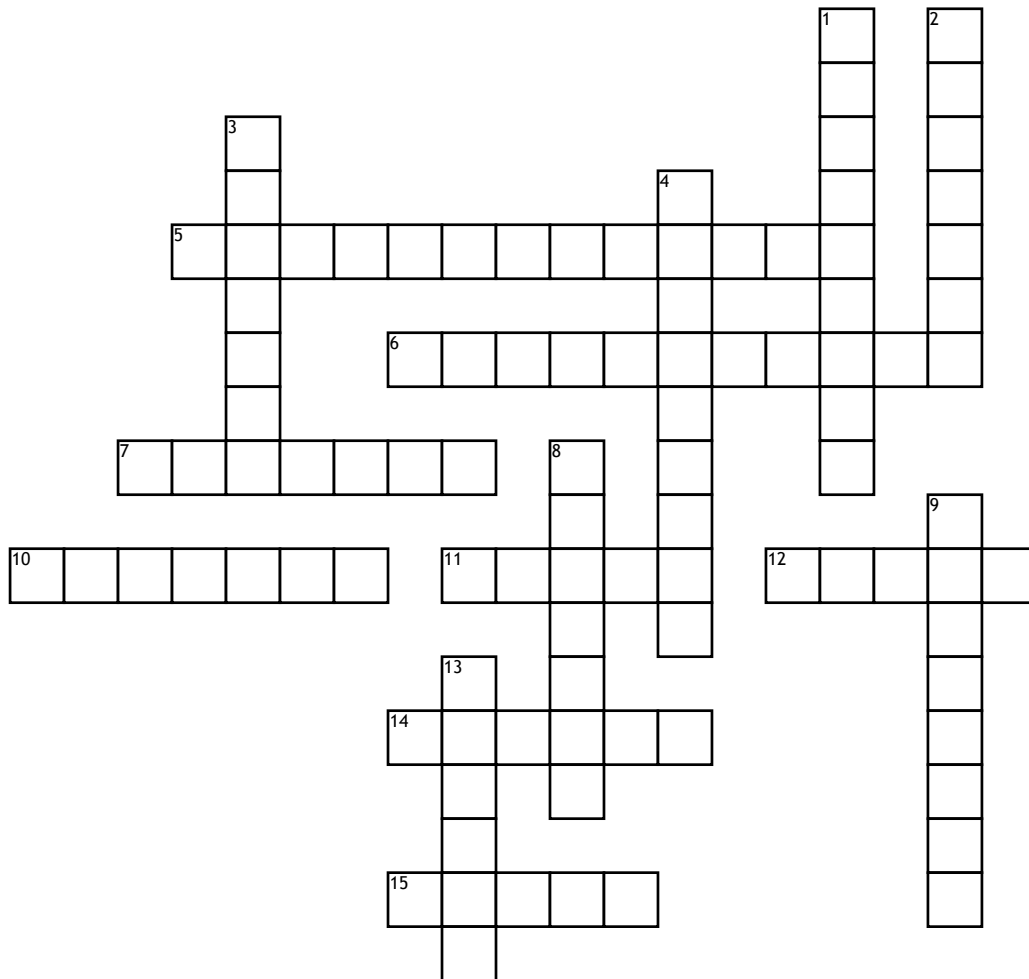


# Grass Fire (Maddie Weymouth)
