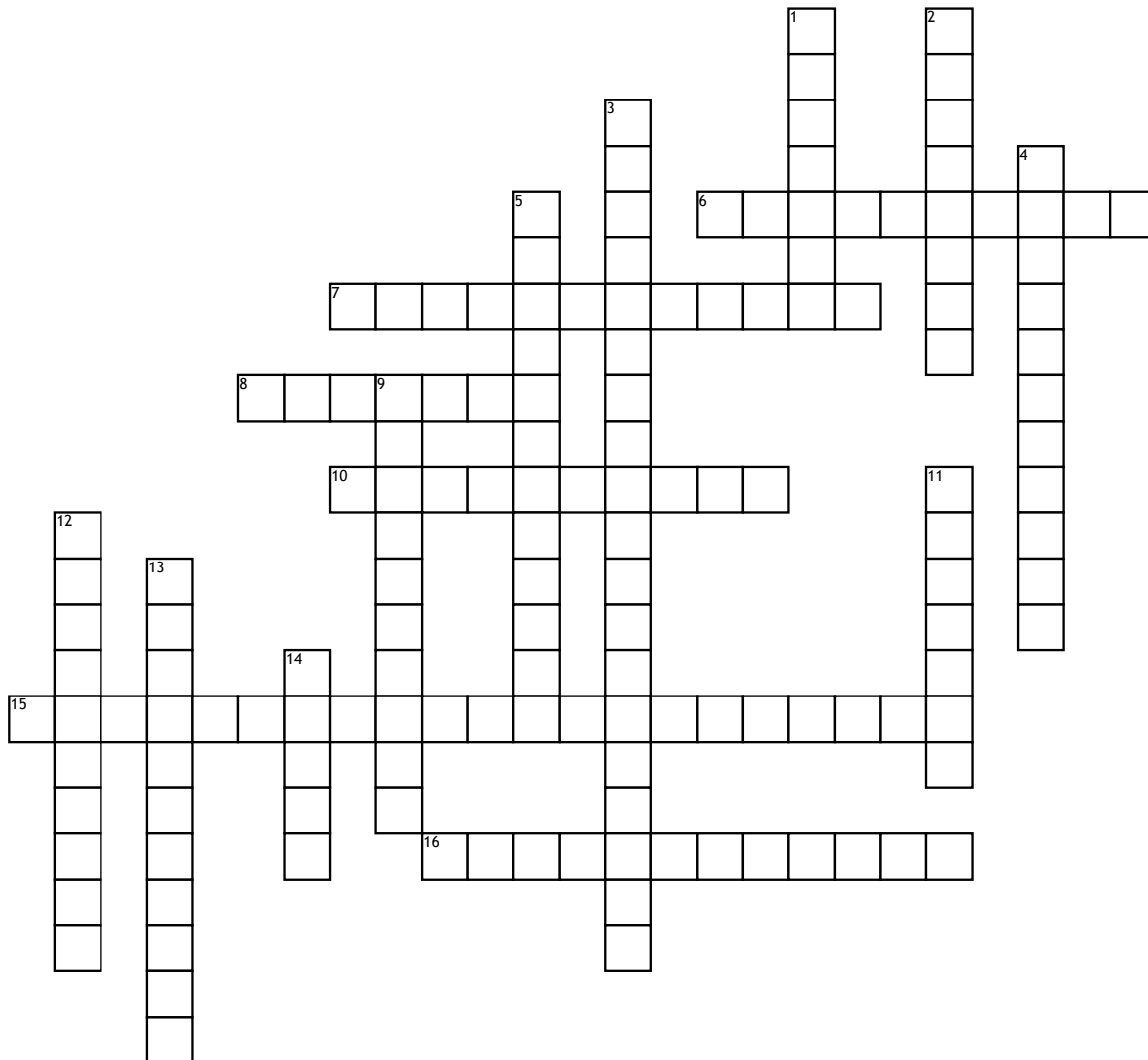

- 6.** A chief of the Sioux who resisted the invasion of the Black Hills and joined Sitting Bull in the defeat of General Custer at Little Bighorn
- 7.** According to Piaget, the process by which new ideas and experiences are absorbed and incorporated into existing mental structures and behaviors
- 8.** men who moved cattle from place to place.
- 10.** allowed farmers and ranchers to keep animals separate from crops.
- 15.** Battle during which the Sioux Tribe defeated the U.S. Army forces led by Colonel George A. Custer.

- 1.** animal that supplied the Plains Indians with most of their needs.
- 2.** a breed of sturdy, long-horned cattle brought by the Spanish to Mexico and suited to the dry conditions of the southwest
- 3.** US soldiers massacred 300 unarmed Native American in 1890. This ended the Indian Wars.
- 4.** a vast prairie region extending from Alberta and Saskatchewan and Manitoba in Canada south through the west central United States into Texas
- 5.** 160 free acres of Land on the west offered to any head of household
- 9.** Sacred burial ground for the Sioux Indians
- 11.** occupation that government agents wanted Native Americans to take up.
- 12.** was a type of farming developed by plowing deeply into the soil.
- 13.** A chief of the Sioux; took up arms against settlers in the northern Great Plains and against United States Army troops; he was present at the battle of Little Bighorn (1876) when the Sioux massacred General Custer's troops
- 14.** Homes made from hardened mud and grass blocks
