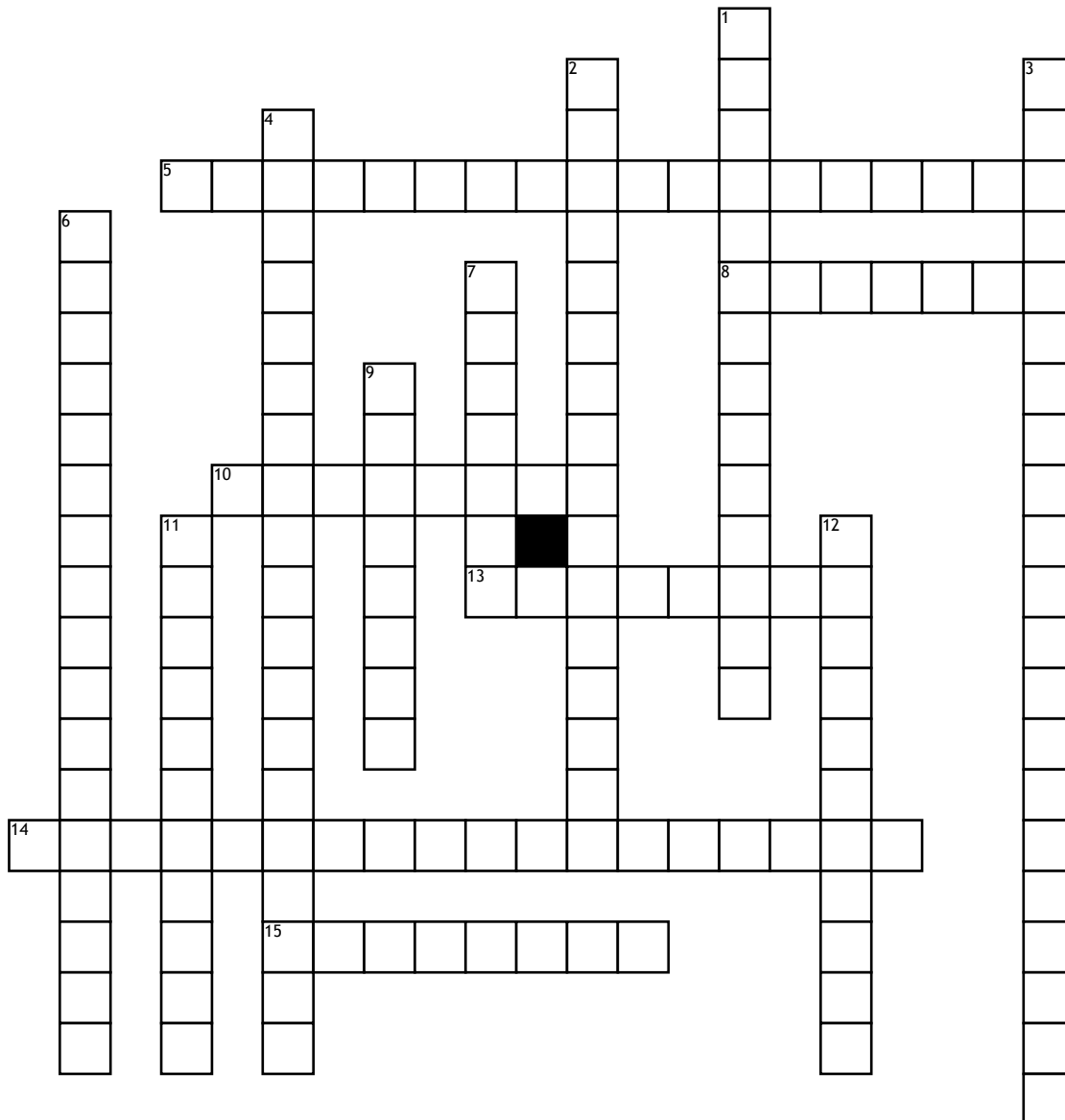

8. A guidance technique that involves moving a child away from others

10. This is when children learn by imitating others

13. This consists of direct and indirect actions used by an adult to help children develop internal controls and appropriate behavior patterns.

14. Experiences that follow naturally as a result of behavior

15. You should use this guidance technique when a child is whining, crying, or throwing a temper tantrum

1. This can include verbal and non verbal actions

2. This involves outside factors that influence behavior

3. Rewarding positive behavior can help mold children's behavior

4. This includes all the communication that occurs within the classroom setting.

6. This consists of actions rather than words

7. This guidance method gives a child an opportunity to change their behavior

9. This guidance technique lets you communicate your perceptions and feelings to a child if they misbehave

11. A result that follows an action or behavior

12. This method allows you to turn a child's attention into a different direction
