1. LSD falls under this category of hallucinogens

  5. Pleasant, exhilarating, even transcendent-like experiences that many users describe as spiritual or divine
  6. This drug has the most potent delivering "high" effects that last anywhere from six to 12 hours
  7. This hallucinogen comes from a cactus
  8. Yellow oily substance known as angel dust
  9. A repeat feeling or sense of a previous "trip" that comes back days, weeks or even years after a user has taken a particular hallucinogenic drug
  10. Naturally found on a certain type of mushrooms that tend to grow in tropical and subtropical regions of the United States, South America and Mexico.
  11. LSD is derived from this type of fungus
  12. Scientist who first synthesized LSD in 1938
  13. Hallucinogenic plant which is part of the mint family.
  14. A white crystalline powder made in a lab
  15. Substance that alters sensory processing in the brain, causing perceptual disturbances, changes in thought processing and depersonalization
  16. Gets its name from an incident that took place in 17th-century Jamestown
  17. Psychedelic commonly used at raves to increase sensory stimulation
  18. Young people experiment with this hallucinogen because it is easy to obtain
