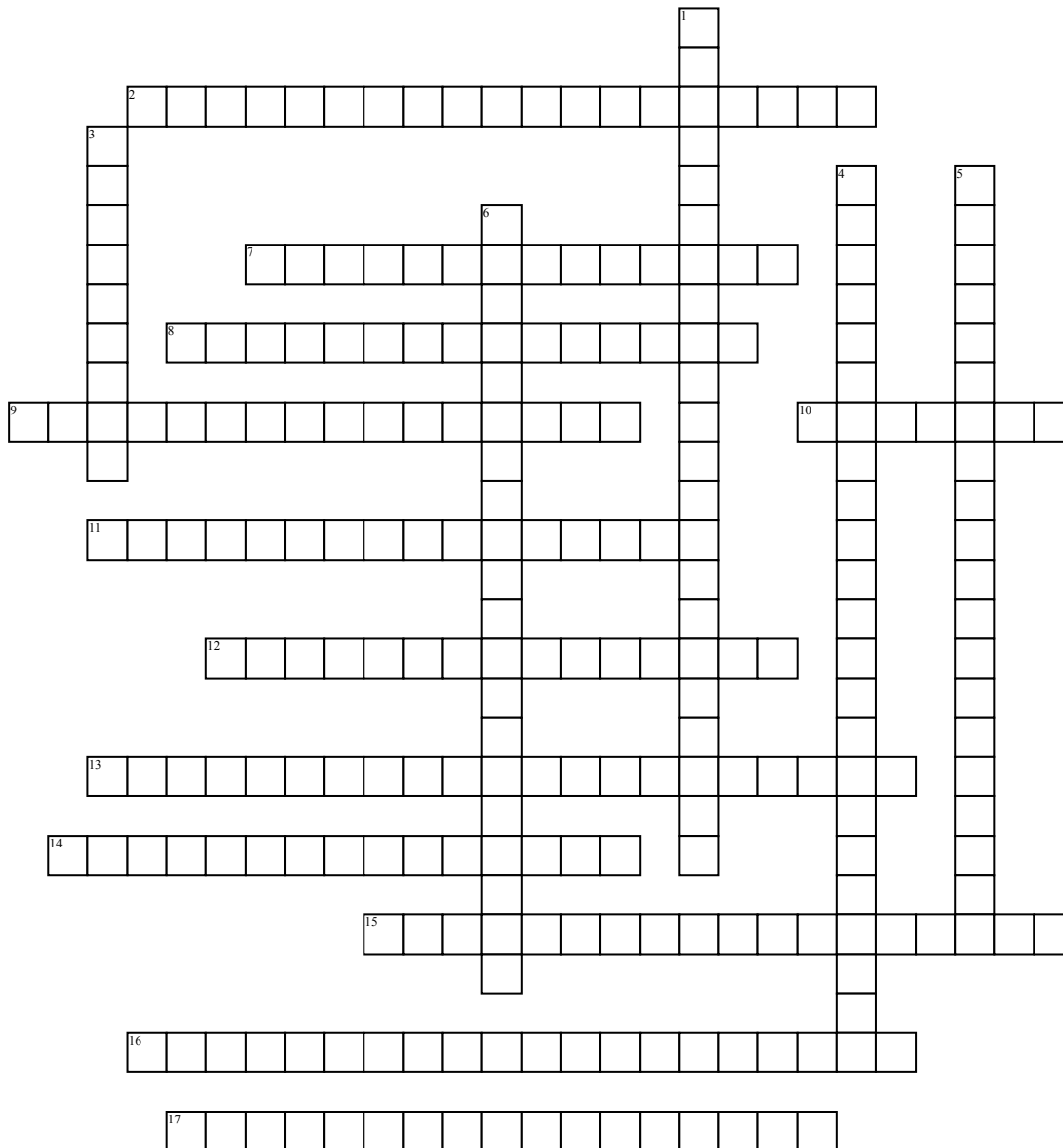

2. Health care services or supplies needed to prevent, diagnose, or treat an illness, injury, condition, disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of medicine.
7. Health care services a person receives at home
8. Care in a hospital that requires an overnight stay.
9. Health Care services that your health insurance or plan doesn't pay or cover.
10. The facilities, providers and suppliers your health insurer or plan has contracted with to provide health care services.
11. The most you pay during a policy period before your health insurance or plan begins to pay 100% of the allowed amount. This limit never includes your premium, balance-billed charges or health care your health insurance or plan doesn't cover.

12. A contract that requires your health insurer to pay some or all of your health care costs in exchange for a premium
13. A fixed amount you pay for covered health care services from providers who do not contract with your health insurance or plan.
14. Services to provide comfort and support for persons in the last stages of a terminal illness and their families.
15. A fixed amount you pay for covered health care services to providers who contract with your health insurance or plan.
16. A provider who doesn't have a contract with your health insurer or plan to provide services to you.
17. Health care services licensed medical physician (M.D- Medical Doctor or D.O - Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine) provides or coordinates

3. A complaint that you communicate to your health insurer or plan.
