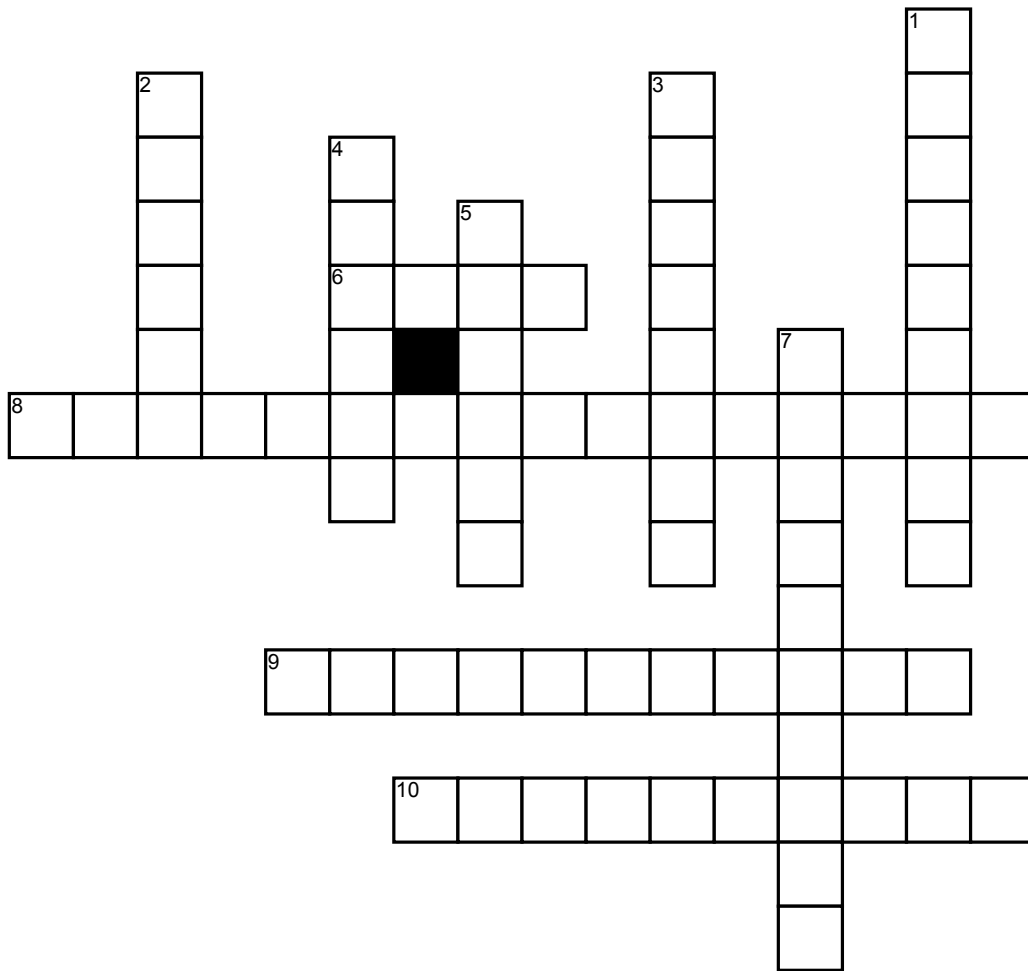

- 1. was a genocide during World War II in which Nazi Germany, aided by its collaborators, systematically murdered approximately 6 million European Jews, around two-thirds of the Jewish population of Europe, between 1941 and 1945.

- 2. A shogun was the military dictator of Japan during the period from 1185 to 1868.
- 3. A Japanese aircraft loaded with explosives and making a deliberate suicidal crash on an enemy target.
- 4. The Battle of Midway was a decisive naval battle in the Pacific Theater of World War II which occurred between 4 and 7 June 1942, only six months after Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor and one month after the Battle of the Coral Sea.
- 5. - One of the great lords who were vassals of the shogun
- 7. battle of World War II between Nazi Germany and its allies, and the Soviet Union, for control of the city of Stalingrad in southwestern Russia.
