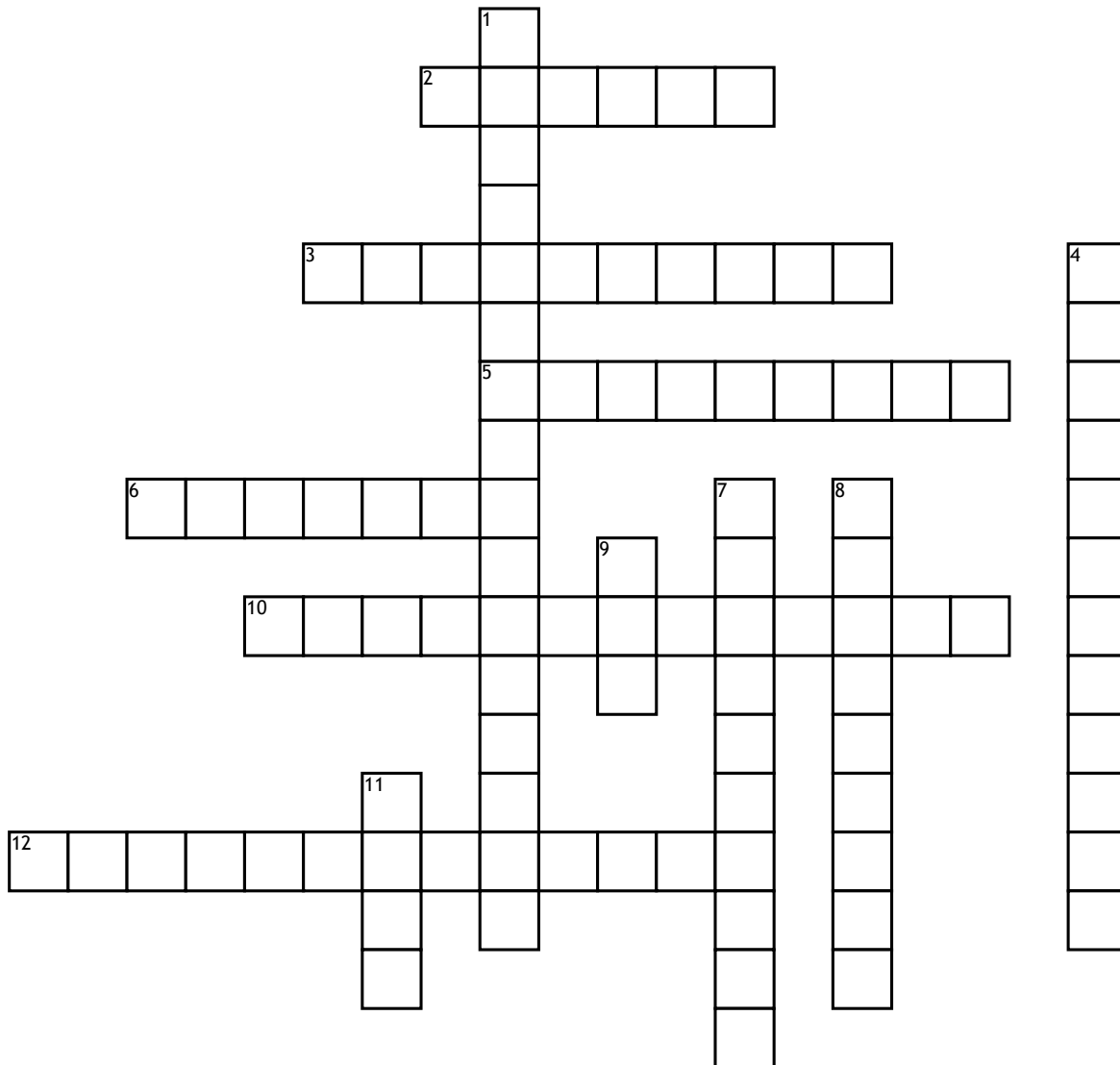


# How education links to practice
