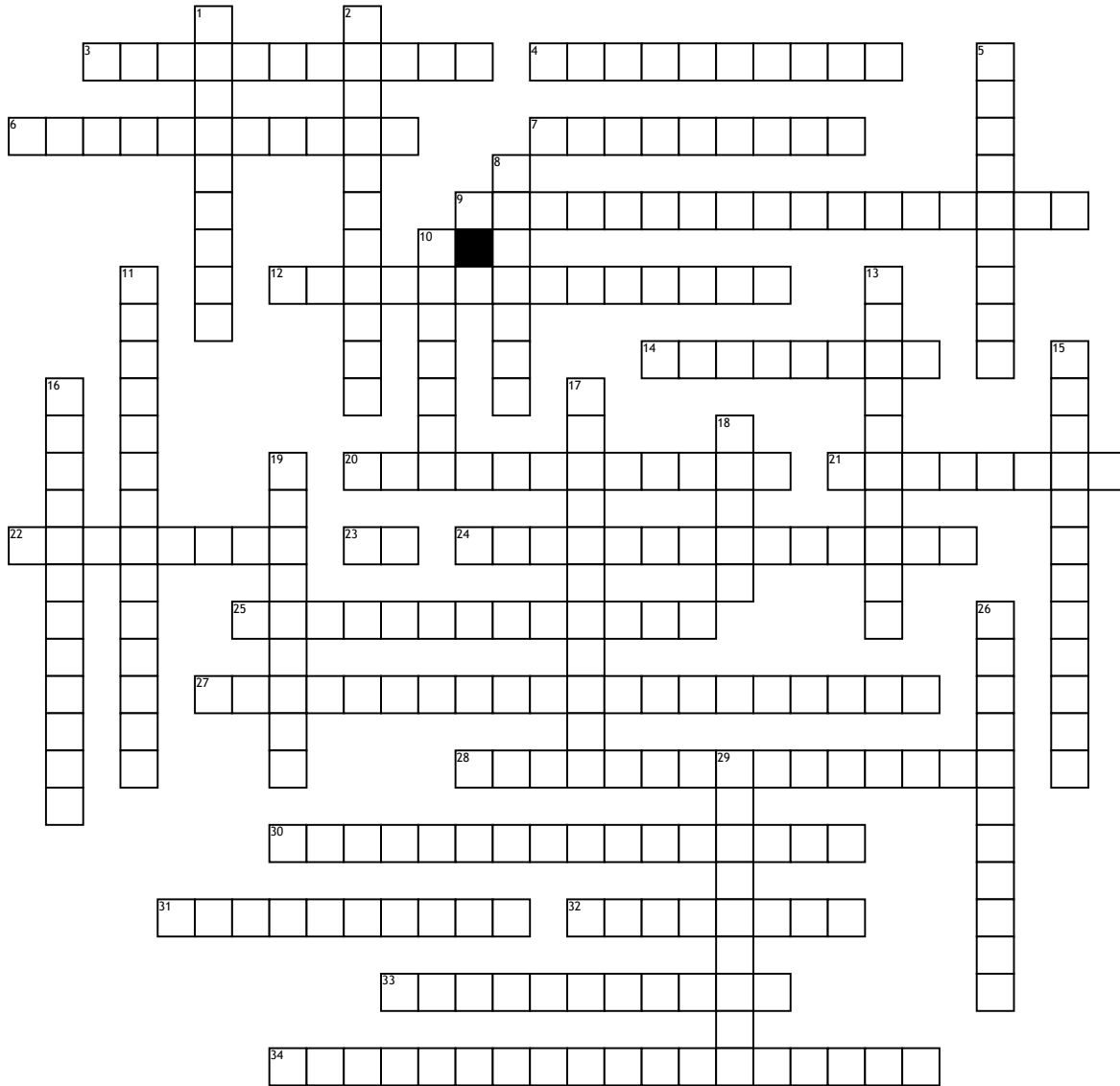


Hydrosphere Crossword
