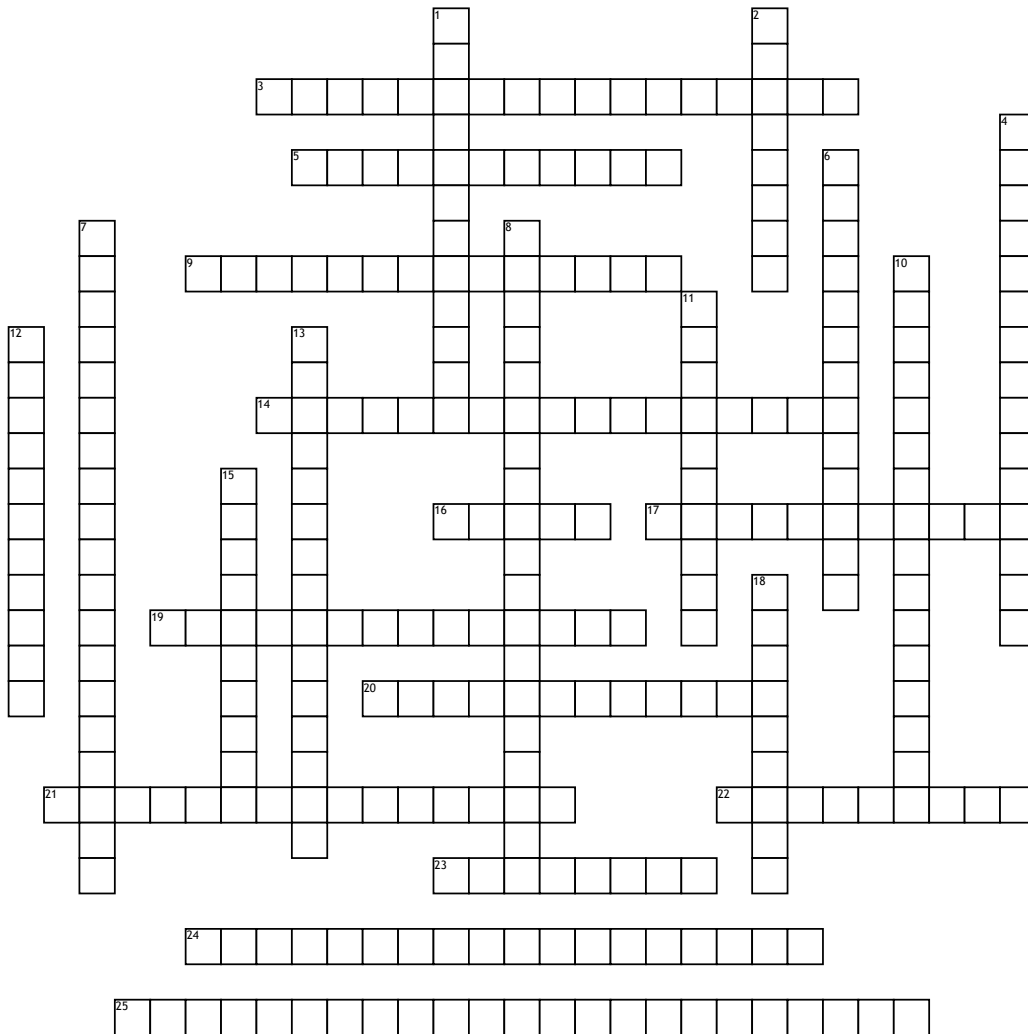


Immigration and Industrialization
