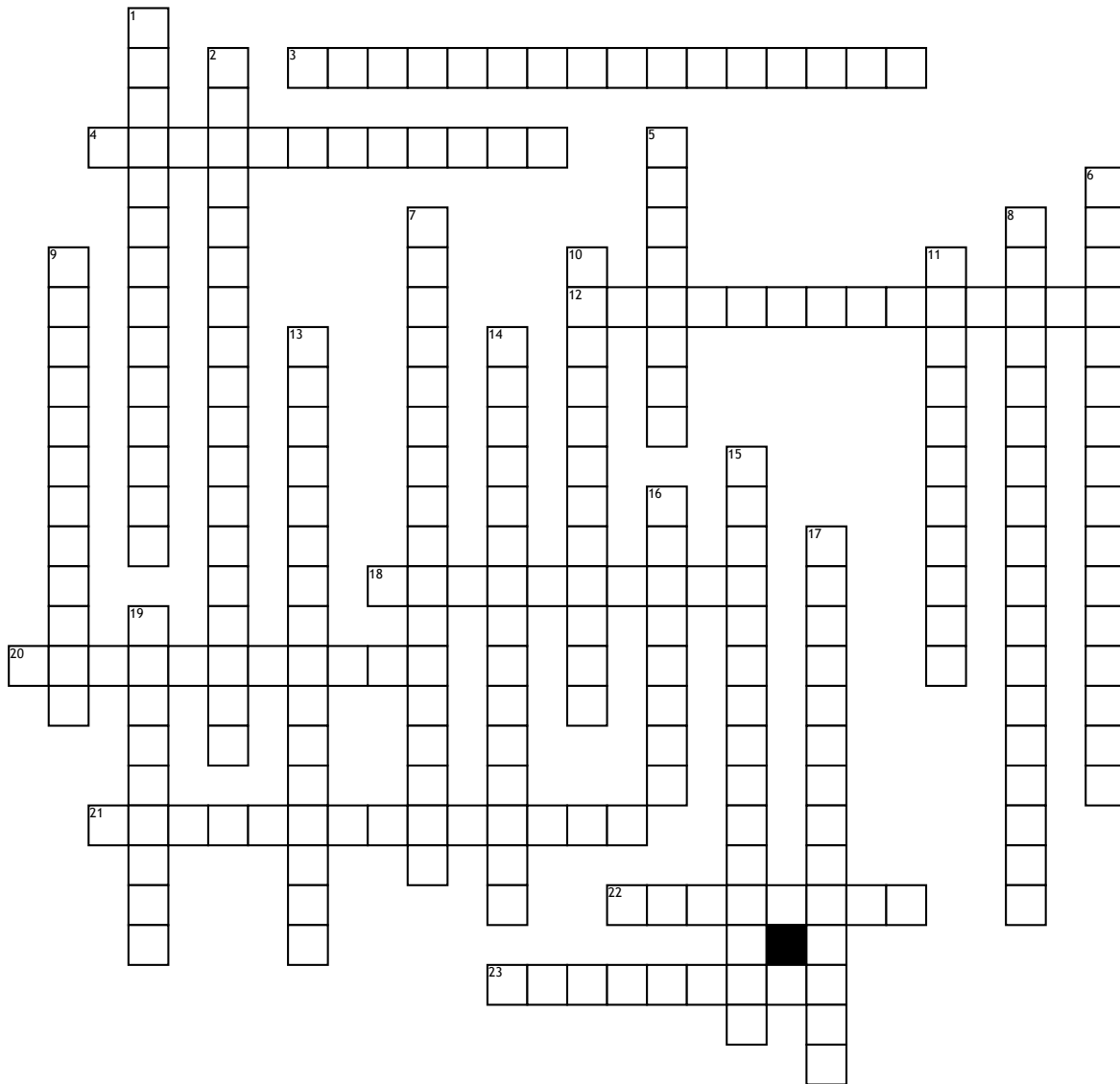

4. Played leading role in Mexico's fight for independence and became Mexico's president in 1833.

12. Raised powerful revolutionary army south of Mexico city. Stood for laws protecting the poor's rights and land redistribution.

18. Example: in 1910 Japan brought Korea under their control.

20. Canal constructed by US in space gifted by Panama for helping with their revolution.

21. A document written by president James Monroe stating that American continents were not subject to future colonization.

22. Latin America army leaders that asserted their power as military dictators/ controlling the new nations.

23. Writer exiled from Cuba by Spanish who returned to launch a second war for Cuban independence.

1. Declared by US in 1899 proposing China's "doors" be open to merchants of all nations.

2. Gave the US the right to be an international police power in the western hemisphere.

5. "Enlightened rule"; Mutsuhito's rule. lasted for 45 years.

6. 1854 Japan opened two ports where US ships could get supplies.

7. An area where foreign nations controlled trade and investment in China.

8. US and Cuba's joined fight for Cuba's independence.

9. A Caudillo who played part in French defeat. Opposed Juarez and gained power through bribes and force.

10. Liberal reformer who strongly influenced Mexico's politics. He prioritized serving people over personal power.

11. Was famous for stealing money from upper class and giving it to the poor.

13. 1904 Japan drove Russian troops out of Korea. They captured most of Russian Pacific fleet and destroyed Russia's Baltic fleet.

14. Rights given to foreign citizens in which they aren't subject to Chinese law at Guangzhou and four Chinese ports.

15. Wanted to strengthen democracy in Mexico. Diaz had him exiled for running for president. Launched armed revolution.

16. War between British and Chinese in 1839 as a result of unanswered plea's from Qing about British merchants selling opium.

17. Poor peasants campaign against Dowager Empress rule as a result of resentment for foreign privileges and Chinese Christians.

19. Led by Juarez and called for redistribution of land separation of church and state and education opportunities for poor.
