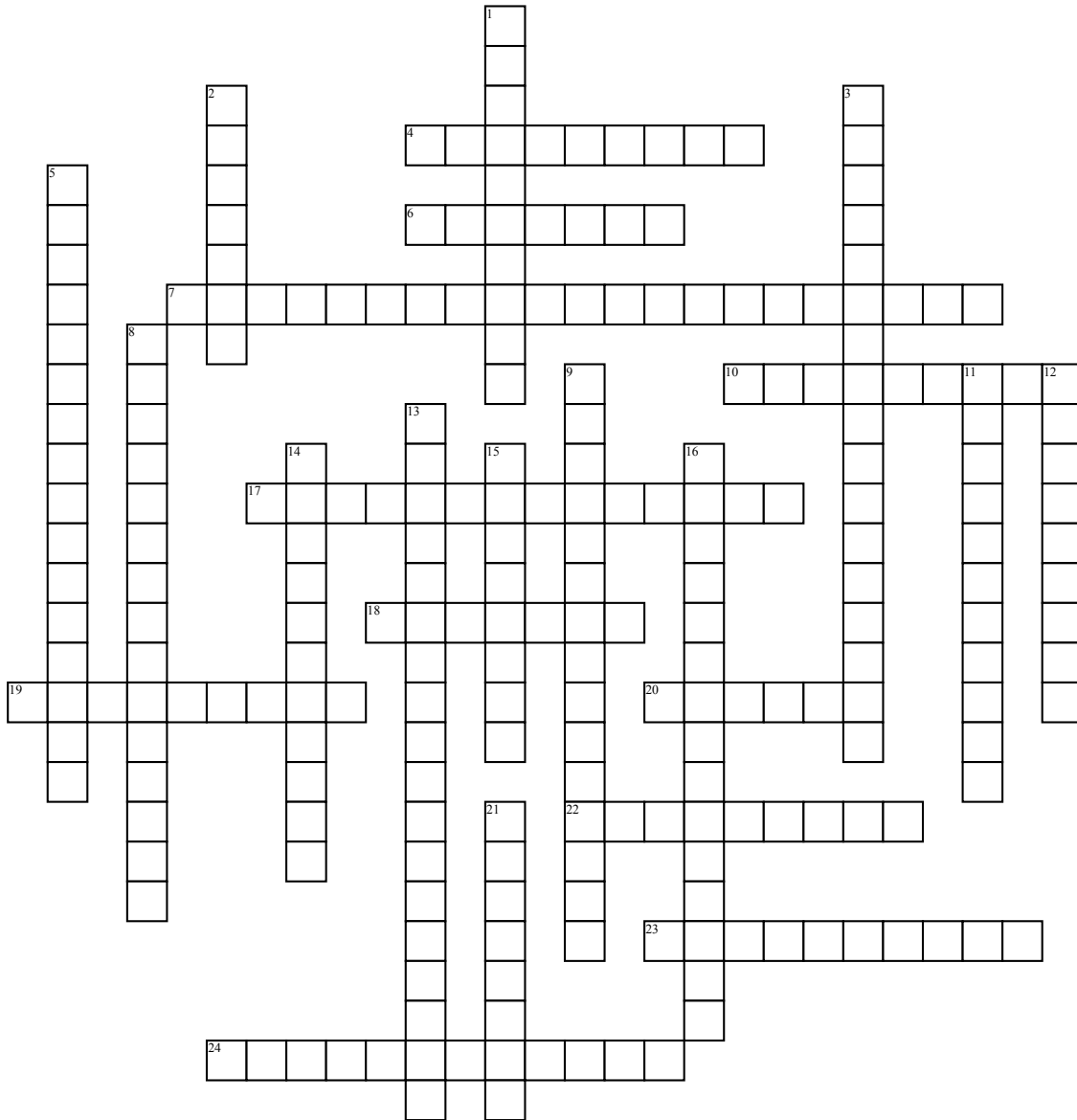

- 7. A treaty that made the U.S. pay Creek Chief McIntosh \$200,000 to give up the last Creek land in Georgia
- 10. A military conflict between European American and Native American in 1780s and 1790s
- 17. An event in which Georgia legislators were bribed to sell land in the Ohio River Valley to four land companies
- 18. An official ban on trade between two countries
- 19. The new capital of the Cherokee Nation in 1825

- 20. An official count of a population in a state, providence, or country; usually records details of individuals
- 22. A set of written characters that represent syllables to be used as an alphabet
- 23. A legal action in court
- 24. The major event that moved multiple Native American groups west that killed thousands of Native Americans in the 19th century

- 1. Dishonest or fraudulent behavior by those in power typically involving bribery
- 2. The acceptance of money or something of value by an official that influences actions
- 3. The acquisition of the Louisiana Territory by the U.S. from France
- 5. The act of giving up land, usually by a treaty

- 8. A treaty signed by the leaders of the Creek people and Henry Knox; the Creek gave up all their land east of the Oconee River
- 9. A system that began in Virginia that grants legal grants of land or "headrights" to settlers
- 11. Southeastern Indians who wanted to peace with the United States in the early 19th century
- 12. Southeastern Indians who wanted to fight the United States in the early 19th century
- 13. The long-term drop in economic productivity in an economy; more severe than a recession
- 14. A lottery that granted Georgia citizens the opportunity to register for a chance to win lots of land
- 15. Legislators in Congress who pushed for war with Great Britain.
