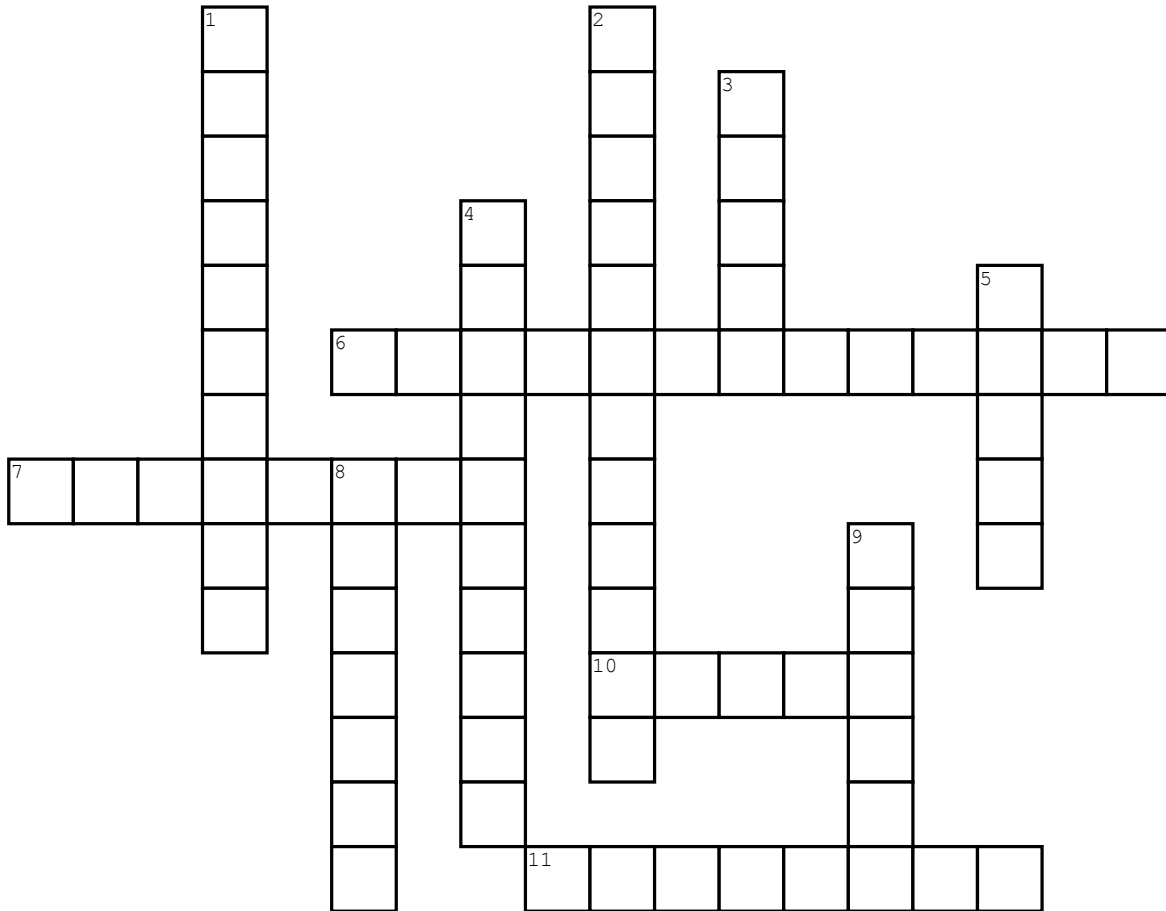


Indigenous Spirituality

- 1. It is a closed structure with a pit where heated rocks are placed.
- 2. Crafted by mothers and grandmothers for their children.
- 3. symbol of knowledge and creativity.
- 4. preferred name by our First Nations, Métis and Inuit people.
- 5. Symbol of inquisitiveness and determination.
- 8. Means "in the likeness of a human" and is a monument made for communication and survival.
- 9. represents abundance and peace.
