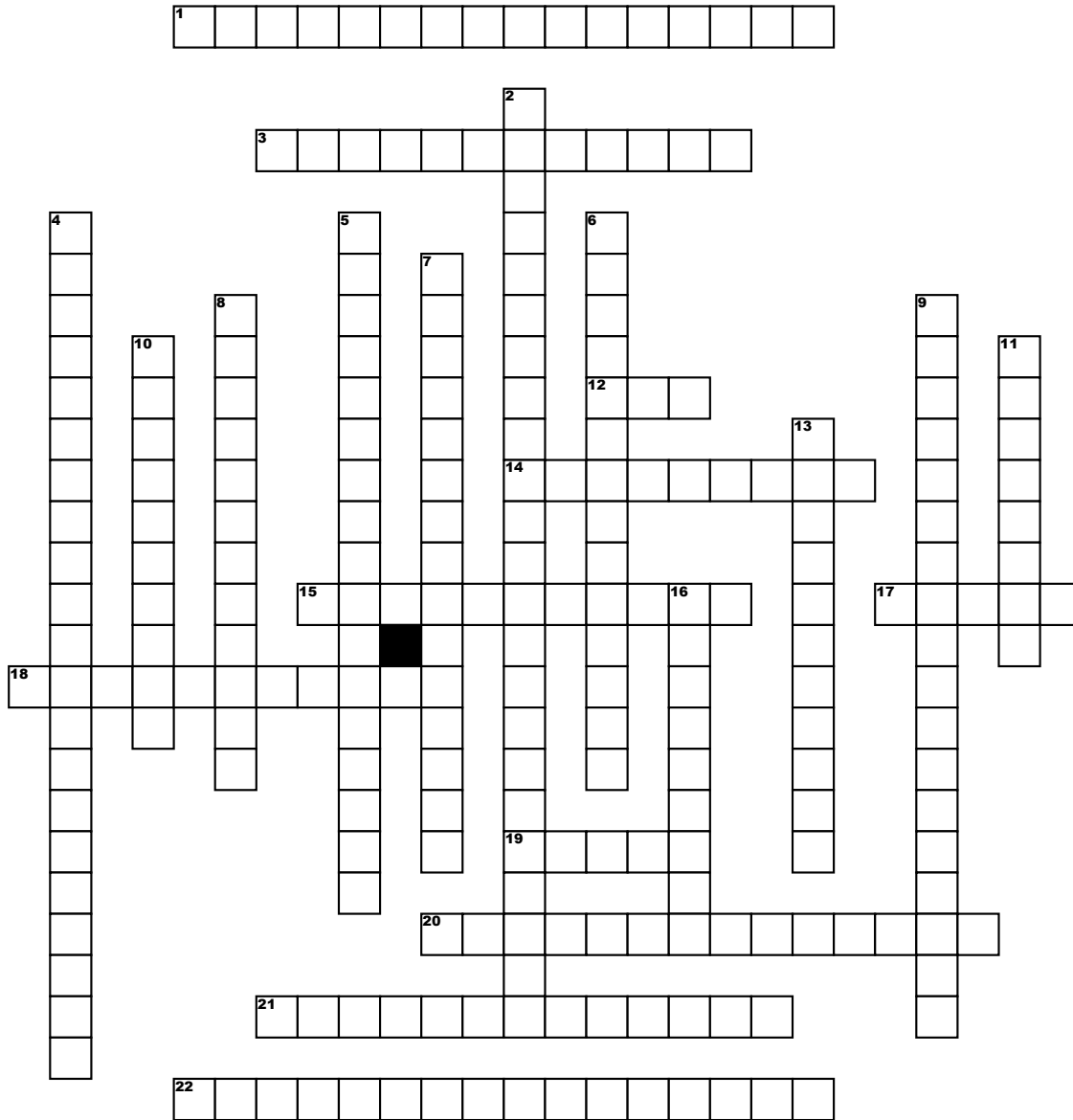


# Industrial Revolution

- 2. company created to control trade between Britain, India, and East Asia
  - 4. The U.S. declared war on Spain following the sinking of the Battleship Maine in Havana harbor. The war ended with the signing of the Treaty of Paris which resulted in Spain losing control over their territories including: Cuba, Puerto Rico, the Philippines, Guam
  - 5. Italian military and political leader, he led the movement for Italian unification

- 6. an attempt to drive all Europeans out of China
- 7. Prussian prime minister, he led the unification of Germany and the creation of the German Empire
- 8. a "let things be" attitude on the part of the government toward industry; government does not control the industries
- 9. areas in China over which other countries had economic power

- 11. German philosopher; he called on workers to overthrow capitalism. His ideas helped inspire socialism
