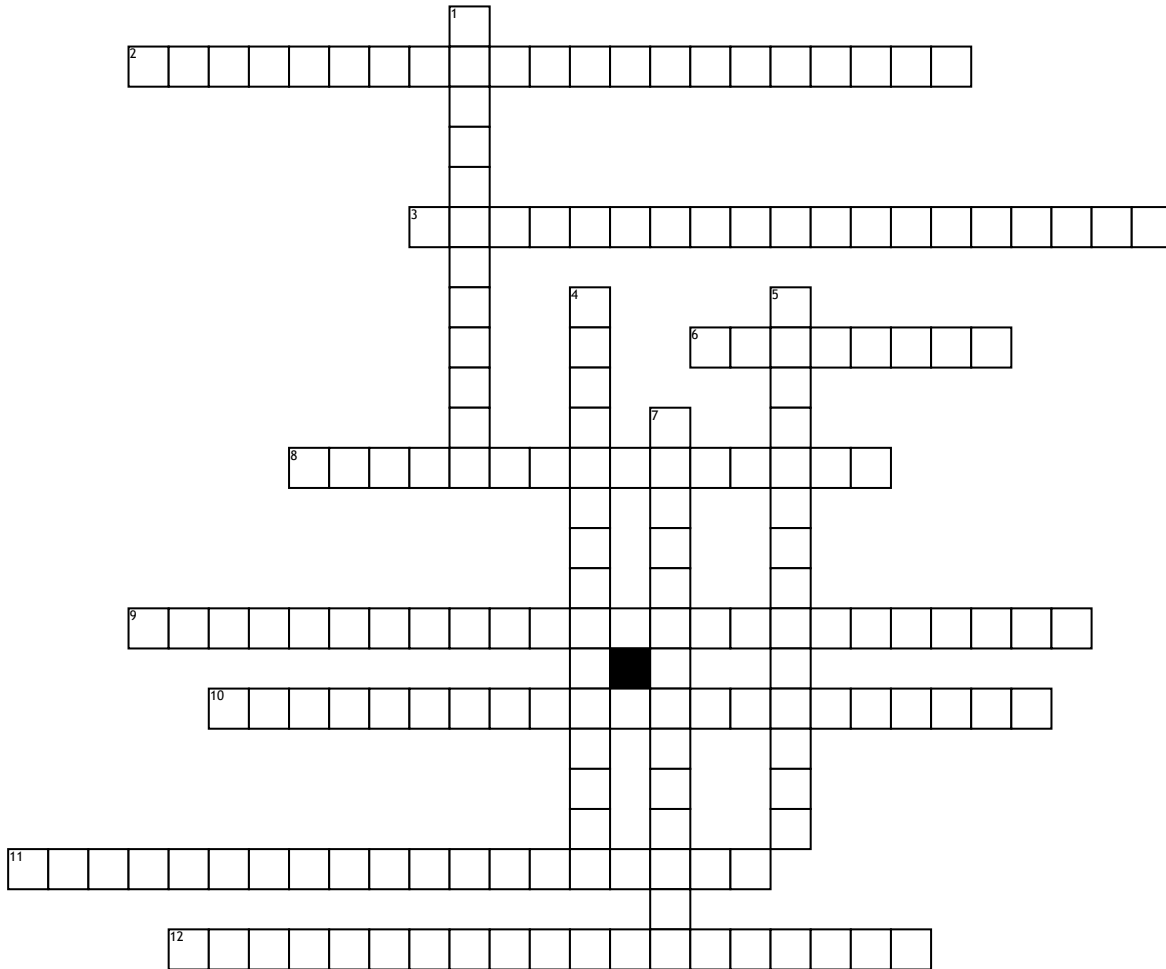

2. The process of a company increasing production of goods or services at the same part of the supply chain.
3. Form of business organization in which all stages of production of a good
6. Large companies that controlled the industry or sector they were in with the ability to control the price of the goods and services they provided.
8. A steel-making process, now largely superseded, in which carbon, silicon, and other impurities are removed from molten pig iron by oxidation in a blast of air in a special tilting retort

9. A train route across the United States that connected the east and west regions of the U.S. by rail

10. This act created an Interstate Commerce Commission to oversee the conduct of the railroad industry.

11. A self-made multi-millionaire who became one of the wealthiest Americans of the 19th century, where he built another empire and helped make railroad transportation more efficient.

12. The first Federal act that outlawed monopolistic business practices.
