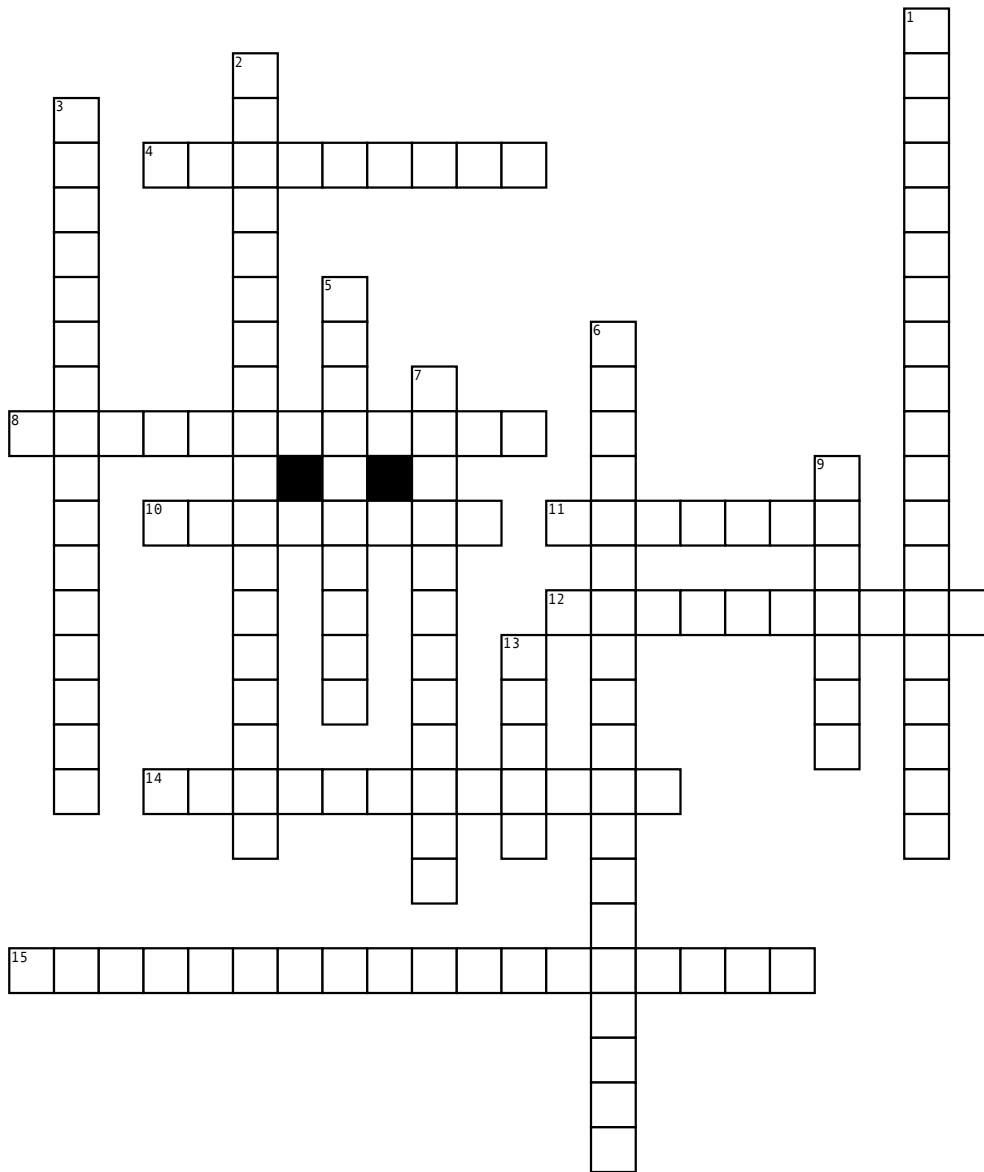


# Infection Control

- 4.** Infection or disease originating outside of or external to the body
- 8.** The use of microorganisms, or biologic agents, as weapons to infect humans, animals, or plants
- 10.** One-celled microorganisms, some of which are beneficial and some of which cause disease
- 11.** Any substance or object that adheres to and transmits infectious material
- 12.** Aseptic control that inhibits, retards growth of, or kills pathogenic organisms; not effective against spores and viruses

- 14.** Containing infection or infectious organisms or germs
- 15.** A set of guidelines that must be followed while caring for patients known to be or suspected to be infected with pathogens that can spread readily from person to person

- 1.** Disease that is transmitted from one individual to another
- 2.** Rules that must be followed while caring for patients known or suspected to be infected with pathogens that can be transferred during coughing, sneezing, talking, or laughing

- 3.** Factors that lead to the transmission or spread of disease
- 5.** Infection or disease originating within the body
- 6.** A set of guidelines that must be followed while caring for patients known to be or suspected to be infected with pathogens that can be transmitted through the air.
- 7.** Aseptic-control method that destroys pathogens but does not usually kill spores and viruses
- 9.** Being free from infection
