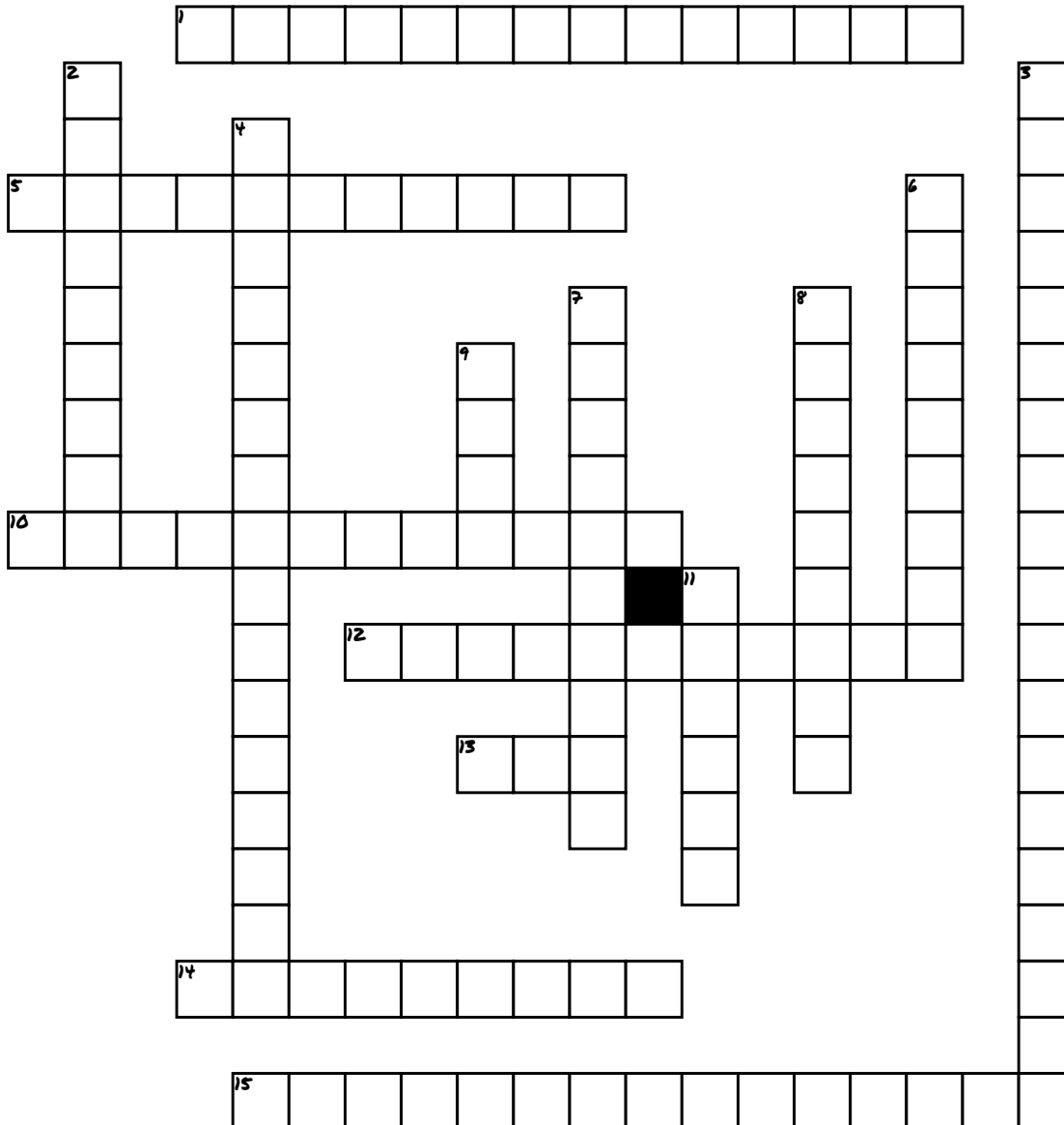


INFECTION CONTROL



ACROSS

- 1. CONFINED TO A PARTICULAR PART OF THE BODY AND APPEARS AS A LESION CONTAINING PUS
- 5. GERMICIDES FORMULATED FOR USE ON SKIN AND REGISTERED AND REGULATED BY THE FDA
- 10. MEANS THAT THEY SHOW NO SYMPTOMS OR SIGN OF INFECTION
- 12. THE PROCESS THAT DESTROYS ALL MICROBIAL LIFE, INCLUDING SPORES, GENERALLY WITH THE USE OF AN AUTOCLAVE
- 13. REGISTERS ALL TYPE OF DISINFECTANTS SOLD AND USED IN THE US
- 14. AIRBORNE VIRUS THAT CAUSE DISEASE AND CAN DAMAGE THE LIVER

- 15. BACTERIA CAPABLE OF PRODUCING A PROTECTIVE COATING THAT ALLOWS THEM TO WITHSTAND VERY HARSH ENVIRONMENTS TO SHED THE COATING WHEN CONDITIONS BECOME MORE FAVORABLE TO THEM

- 2. AN ITEM IS MADE OR CONSTRUCTED OF A MATERIAL THAT HAS NO PORES OR OPENINGS AND CANNOT ABSORB LIQUID
- 3. DISEASE-CAUSING MICROORGANISMS THAT CARRIED IN THE BODY OR BODY FLUID (HEPATITIS AND HIV)

- 4. PROCESS OF PROPERLY HANDLING STERILIZED AND DISINFECTED EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES TO REDUCE CONTAMINATION
- 6. CHEMICAL PROCESS FOR REDUCING THE NUMBER OF DISEASE-CAUSING GERMS ON CLEANED SURFACES TO A SAFE LEVEL
- 7. CAPABLE OF DESTROYING MOLD AND FUNGI
- 8. INVASION OF BODY TISSUE BY DISEASE-CAUSING PATHOGENS
- 9. *WU*. METHICILLIN-RESISTANT/*STAPHYLOCOCCUS AUREUS*
- 11. ANOTHER FUNGUS, AFFECTS PLANTS OR GROWS ON INANIMATED OBJECTS, BUT DOES NOT CAUSE HUMAN INFECTION
