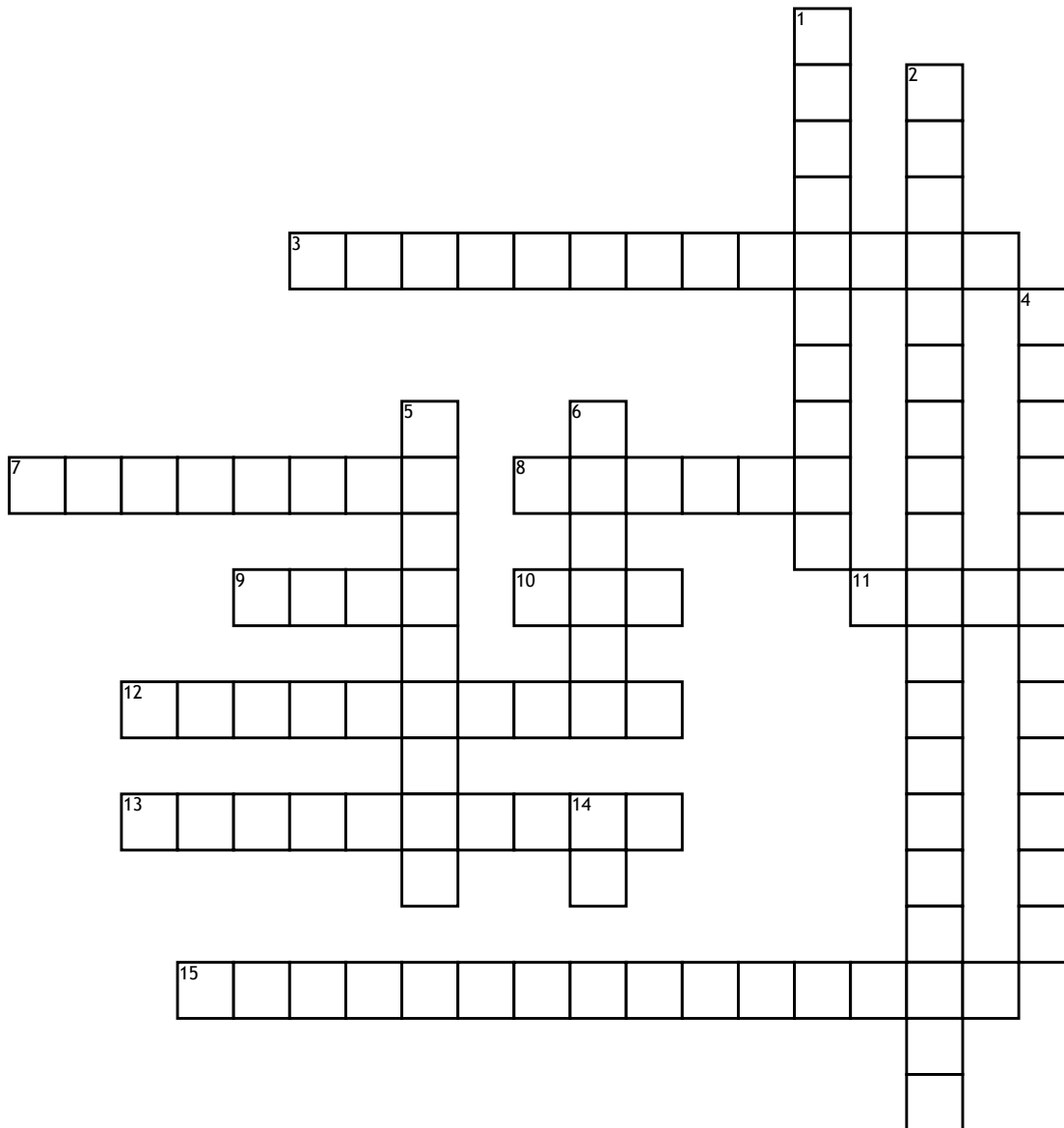

1. Symptoms, include fatigue, low appetite, stomach pain, nausea, and jaundice, that usually resolve within 2 months of infection

2. disease-causing microorganisms carried in the body by blood or body fluids, such as hepatitis and HIV

4. A condition in which the body reacts to injury, irritation, or infection

5. Blood-borne virus that causes disease and can damage the liver
