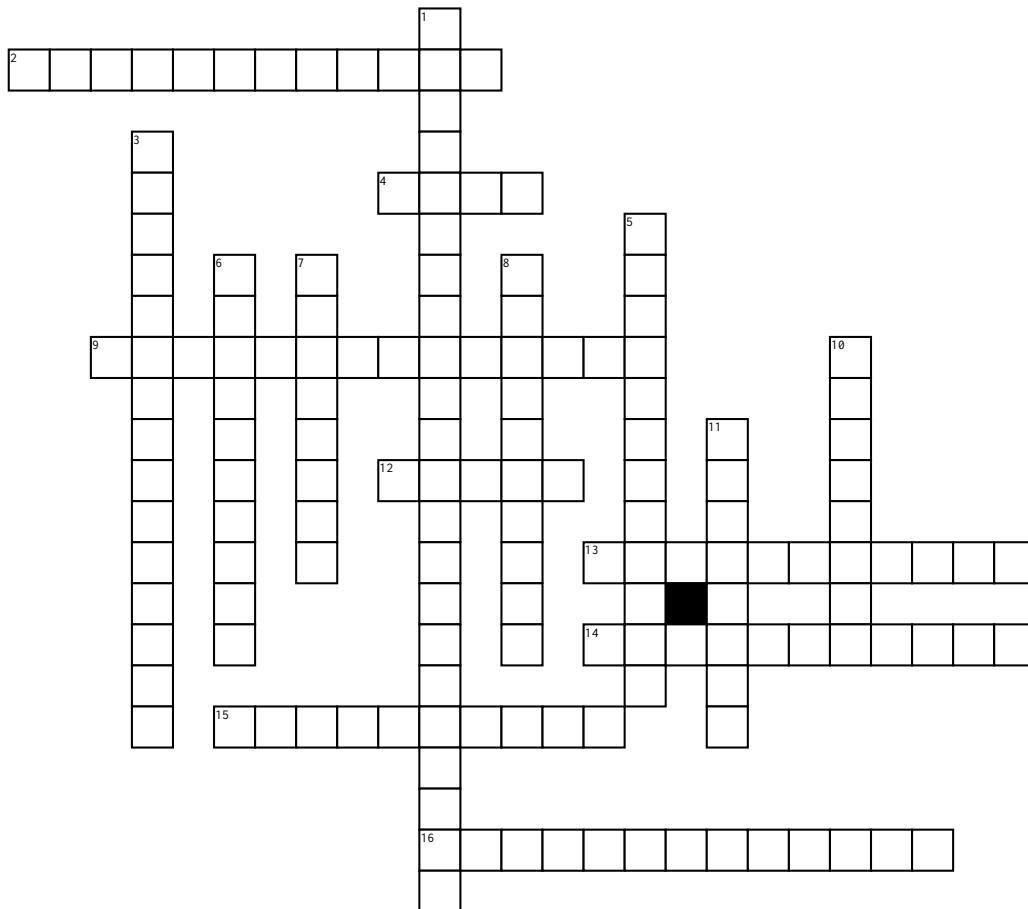


Intelligence crossword puzzle
