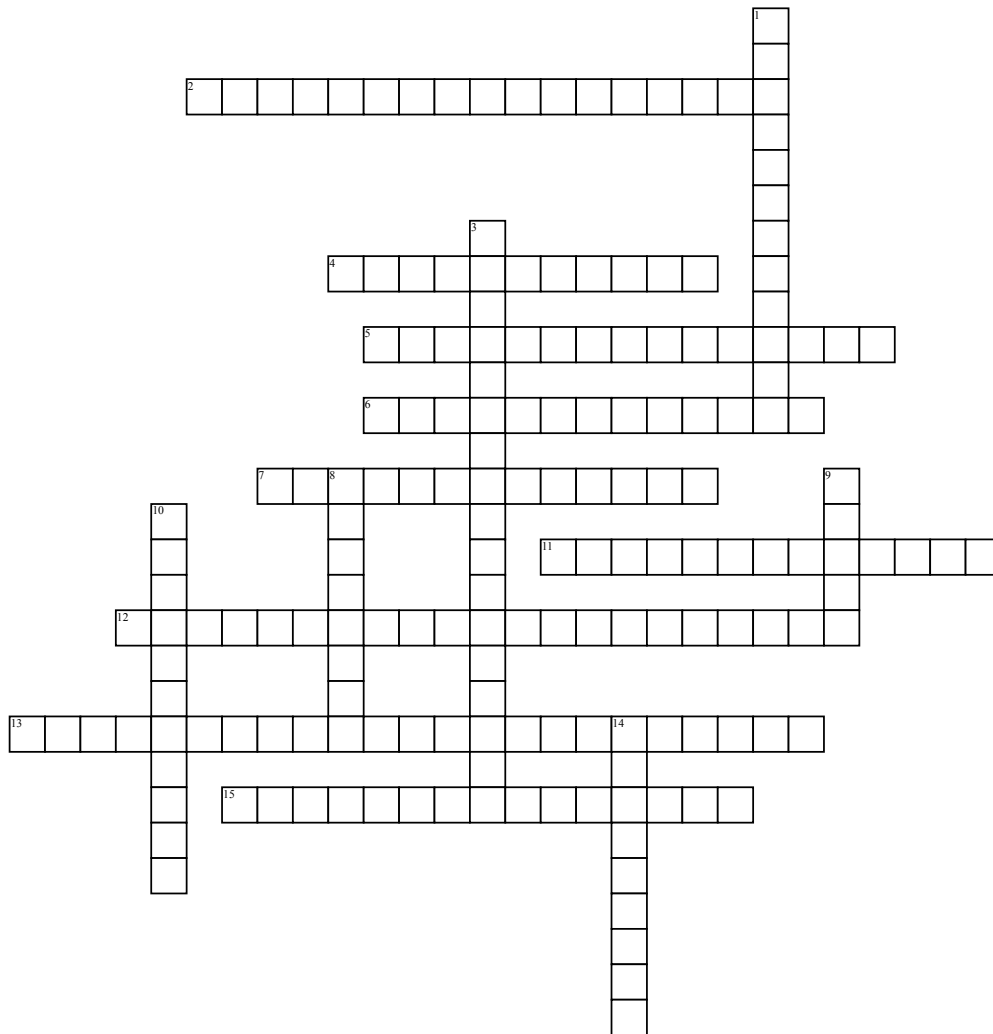


Jefferson and the Louisiana Purchase
